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DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT. JUNE 27TH AT 4:02. RITZ CARLTON, MARINA DEL REY.

DR. MURRAY: HI.

DETECTIVE SMITH: HI.

MR. CHERNOFF: I'M ED CHERNOFF.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SCOTT SMITH.

MR. CHERNOFF: GOOD TO SEE YOU, SCOTT SMITH.

MR. PENA: THIS IS DR. MURRAY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DR. MURRAY.

MR. PENA: I'M MICHAEL PENA.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SIT RIGHT HERE. THIS

ALL RIGHT?

OKAY. WE'LL JUST MAKE THIS AS PAINLESS AND AS QUICK AS POSSIBLE. DOCTOR, CAN I START OFF WITH SOME BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION?

MR. CHERNOFF: HEY, GUYS, BEFORE WE START, CAN WE REITERATE ONE THING?

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TO YOU. SO ONCE AGAIN, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR

MEETING WITH US. I HOPE YOU UNDERSTAND THAT NONE OF

THE CIRCUS THAT'S BEEN GOING ON HAS BEEN ON OUR -
COMING FROM US, NONE OF THE COMMENTS AND STUFF.

WE UNDERSTAND THAT YOU SPOKE WITH SOME DETECTIVES AT

THE HOSPITAL.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: UNFORTUNATELY, THEY
WEREN'T HANDLING THE CASE. THEY JUST WERE THE
DIVISION THAT WAS RIGHT THERE IN THE AREA. SO THEY -WE WERE COMING FROM DOWNTOWN. THEY WERE FROM RIGHT
THERE. THEY SHOWED UP. THEY WERE HELPING US OUT.
AND SO THEY DIDN'T DO A FORMAL INTERVIEW. THEY
BASICALLY TOOK NOTES AFTER WE COULDN'T -- AFTER YOU
HAD LEFT.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO THAT'S WHY WE WANTED
TO --

DR. MURRAY: OH, THEY TOOK NOTES AFTER I LEFT?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH. I MEAN THEY TOOK
VERY FEW NOTES, BUT THEY KNEW THAT THEY WEREN'T
HANDLING IT. SO THEY THOUGHT THAT WE WERE GOING TO
TALK.

DR. MURRAY: OH, OKAY. I SEE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN A DOCTOR FOR MR. JACKSON?

DR. MURRAY: AT FIRST I WAS ATTENDING TO HIM IN 2006.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND IT WAS CONTINUOUS, 2006 ON?

DR. MURRAY: NO. WELL, NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OR ON AND OFF?

DR. MURRAY: OFF AND ON, INTERMITTENT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. DO YOU KNOW IF
HE WAS UNDER THE CARE OF ANY OTHER DOCTORS?

DR. MURRAY: HE NEVER DISCLOSED THAT TO ME, BUT BECAUSE HE MOVED AROUND SO MUCH, I WOULD ASSUME THAT HE WAS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO YOU'RE NOT SURE IF YOU WERE THE ONLY DOCTOR.

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY, DOCTOR. WHAT KIND OF DOCTOR ARE YOU?

DR. MURRAY: I AM A CARDIO -- INTERVENTIONAL CARDIOLOGIST IS MY SUBSPECIALTY. I AM A CARDIOLOGIST AS A SPECIALIST. I HAVE A SPECIALTY ALSO IN INTERNAL MEDICINE. ALL THREE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DID THE JACKSONS,
SPECIFICALLY MICHAEL, SEEK YOU OUT FOR THAT REASON,

BECAUSE YOU'RE A CARDIOLOGIST OR --

DR. MURRAY: NO. I FIRST MET HIM IN 2006, WHEN A PATIENT FRIEND, WHO WAS A SECURITY GUARD WITH HIM, ASKED THAT I SEE HIM AS A REQUEST, BECAUSE HE WAS NOT FEELING WELL AND HE WANTED TO SEE A DOCTOR.

(INTERRUPTION.)

MR. CHERNOFF: YES. THANK YOU.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHEN YOU FIRST STARTED ATTENDING, SEEING MICHAEL JACKSON IN 2006, WHAT WAS THAT FOR?

DR. MURRAY: THERE WAS A FAMILY FLU ILLNESS BETWEEN HIMSELF AND HIS CHILDREN. THEY WERE COUGHING AND HAD RUNNY NOSE, AND THEY FELT DEHYDRATED, AND THEY WERE NOT REALLY GETTING ENOUGH REST AT THAT TIME.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND I'M SORRY. YOU WERE REFERRED BY A PATIENT OF YOURS?

DR. MURRAY: A PATIENT'S SON, WHO ALSO IS A PATIENT OF MY PRACTICE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND HE WAS HIS SECURITY GUARD?

DR. MURRAY: HE IS A SECURITY GUARD, AND HE MADE THE RECOMMENDATION.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. THIS LAST SECTION OF TIME THAT YOU'VE BEEN CARING FOR HIM, HOW

LONG CONTINUOUSLY HAS IT BEEN?

DR. MURRAY: A LITTLE OVER TWO MONTHS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LITTLE OVER TWO MONTHS.

COULD YOU TELL US HOW THAT CAME TO BE?

DR. MURRAY: I WAS CALLED BY MR. JACKSON'S ASSISTANT. HIS NAME IS AMIR.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AMIR.

DR. MURRAY: BROTHER AMIR.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH.

DR. MURRAY: AND HE SAID MR. JACKSON WANTED TO SPEAK WITH ME. AND THEN HE MENTIONED THAT FOR THE FIRST TIME, BECAUSE I HADN'T SEEN HIM FOR A WHILE, THAT THEY WERE GOING TO BE DOING A CONCERT TOUR IN ENGLAND AND MR. JACKSON WOULD VERY MUCH LIKE ME TO BE PART OF THE TRIP AND TO BE THERE FOR THE CONCERTS, AND WOULD I AGREE TO THAT. AND I SAID, "WELL, I NEED MORE DETAILS ABOUT THAT," AND THAT WAS IT. THAT WAS BASICALLY THE GIST OF THE QUESTION.

THEN HE CALLED MR. JACKSON APPARENTLY. I
WAS NOT PRESENT. AND SHORTLY AFTER, WITHIN AN HOUR OR
SO, I GOT A CALL FROM MR. JACKSON TELLING ME HOW
ELATED HE WAS THAT I WAS GOING TO JOIN THE TRIP. OF
COURSE, I DID NOT HAVE A COMMITMENT MADE, BUT THAT WAS
HOW IT STARTED.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. AND I'M SURE YOU

GUYS HAVE HEARD ON THE NEWS. THE NEWS IS REPORTING
THAT YOU DON'T WORK FOR MR. JACKSON BUT YOU WORK FOR
A.E.G. IS THAT CORRECT OR INCORRECT?

DR. MURRAY: HOW DO I DEFINE THAT? WELL,

MR. JACKSON ASKED ME TO BE ON HIS TEAM. I WAS TALKING

TO MR. JACKSON HIMSELF. HE OFFERED ME EMPLOYMENT, AND

I WAS OF THE OPINION THAT HE WOULD BE MY EMPLOYER

DIRECTLY. SUBSEQUENTLY TO ACCEPTING THAT, I -- I

REALIZED THAT A.E.G. WOULD BE THE ONE PAYING FOR THE

SALARY THAT HE REQUESTED. SO THAT WAS THEIR

ARRANGEMENT AS FAR AS WHAT THEY WOULD FINANCE ME. SO

I AM AN EMPLOYEE FOR MICHAEL JACKSON BUT PAID THROUGH

A.E.G. DOES THAT HELP YOU?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, YEAH. SO MICHAEL PICKED YOU, BUT SOMEBODY ELSE IS GETTING THE TAB.

DR. MURRAY: I HAD NO IDEA THAT THAT WAS THE CASE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. OKAY. SO TWO

MONTHS CARING FOR HIM. DID THIS -- HAS THE TWO MONTHS

ALL BEEN HERE IN CALIFORNIA, OR WAS IT SPLIT BETWEEN

HERE AND LAS VEGAS?

DR. MURRAY: BASICALLY HERE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BASICALLY HERE?

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. CAN YOU TELL US

ABOUT THE GENERAL HEALTH OF MR. JACKSON?

DR. MURRAY: GENERALLY SPEAKING, HE WAS NOT
A PERSON WHO ATE WELL. HE'S VERY THIN. THERE WERE -I KNEW HE PROBABLY WAS SEEING OTHER PHYSICIANS FOR
OTHER ISSUES THAT HE DOES NOT DISCLOSE TO ME, CLEARLY.
SO I'M NOT SURE IF HE WAS SO VERY CANDID ABOUT ALL OF
HIS GENERAL CONDITIONS. BUT DURING A CURSORY PHYSICAL
EXAMINATION, I DID NOT FIND ANY MAJOR PHYSICAL CHANGE
EXCEPT FOR A SUBLUXATION OF HIS RIGHT HIP.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: A WHAT?

DR. MURRAY: SUBLUXATION.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I DON'T KNOW WHAT THAT MEANS.

DR. MURRAY: HE -- IT'S LIKE IF YOU HAVE A
JOINT THAT GOES OUT OF PLACE AND COMES BACK IN AT A
CERTAIN ANGLE. SO WHENEVER HE BENT TO 90 DEGREES OR
GREATER, HIS RIGHT HIP WOULD SLIP OUT OF JOINT - SITS
BACK UP, SLIDES BACK IN. THAT WAS THE CASE. HE HAD
SOME FUNGAL DISEASE OF THE TOES, WHICH WAS TREATED
BEFORE, AND THAT WAS WELL. NO OTHER SYSTEMIC ILLNESS,
LIKE HYPERTENSION OR HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE OR SO, WAS
RECOGNIZED BY ME.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YOU HAVE ANY FOLLOW-UPS ON THAT?

DETECTIVE SMITH: NO, NOT ON THAT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: GO AHEAD. JUMP IN. DETECTIVE SMITH: THE DAY THAT YOU WERE NOTIFIED -- I GUESS IT WOULD HAVE BEEN SOMETIME LATE WEDNESDAY EVENING INTO THE EARLY MORNING HOURS OF THURSDAY -- WHO TELEPHONED YOU?

DR. MURRAY: I WAS TELEPHONED BY AMIR, BROTHER MICHAEL AMIR, LETTING ME KNOW THAT MR. JACKSON WAS FINISHING REHEARSAL AROUND THAT TIME. I LOOKED AT MY WATCH WHEN I GOT THE CALL. IT WAS ABOUT 12:10 IN THE MORNING, 12:10 A.M. AND I WOULD MEET THEM AT THE HOME.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DID HE MENTION ANY --JUST THAT -- JUST THAT REHEARSAL WAS FINISHING, OR DID HE SAY THAT THERE WERE ANY PROBLEMS?

DR. MURRAY: I ASKED ABOUT PROBLEMS, BECAUSE I CONSTANTLY MADE THAT INQUIRY INTO HOW WELL HE HAD DONE THAT DAY, DID HE PERFORM WELL. AND I'M TOLD THAT HE HAD A LOT OF MEETINGS, THAT HE DID A PARTIAL PERFORMANCE, NOT FULL PERFORMANCE. AND HE WANTED ME THERE BY THE TIME HE'D GOTTEN HOME.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO HE DIDN'T COMPLAIN OF ANYTHING, JUST WANTED YOU THERE AT THE HOUSE NORMALLY.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WE UNDERSTAND THAT YOU

HAD BEEN SPENDING SOME NIGHTS AT THE -- AT THE HOUSE?

DR. MURRAY: NOT SOME NIGHTS. I SPENT EVERY

NIGHT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, EVERY NIGHT?

DR. MURRAY: WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE NIGHTS I WAS OFF, WHICH WAS ON A SUNDAY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WAS IT FOR MEDICAL REASONS OR JUST TO MAKE HIM FEEL BETTER, THAT YOU SPENT THE NIGHT?

DR. MURRAY: IT WAS MR. JACKSON'S REQUEST.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO YOU WERE THERE SIX NIGHTS A WEEK?

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND SUNDAY WAS TYPICALLY YOUR DAY OFF.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: UNLESS SOMETHING --

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- SHOULD HAPPEN TO MICHAEL.

DR. MURRAY: SURE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. THE BEDROOM WHERE
HE WAS -- WELL, LET ME BACK UP A LITTLE BIT. WHAT
TIME DID YOU ARRIVE THERE THAT NIGHT AFTER YOU

RECEIVED THIS CALL AT A LITTLE AFTER MIDNIGHT?

DR. MURRAY: IT TOOK -- I GOT THERE ABOUT

ONE -- 12:50, CLOSE TO 1:00 O'CLOCK.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DID YOU ARRIVE ALONE?

DETECTIVE SMITH: DID YOU ARRIVE ALONE?

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHEN YOU GOT THERE, WHAT TOOK PLACE?

DR. MURRAY: I WENT TO MR. JACKSON'S ROOM.

OF COURSE, HE HAS TWO ROOMS IN THE HOUSE. THE ONE

THAT I WAS CUSTOMARILY SEEING HIM AT, I WENT TO HIS

ROOM, AND I WAITED FOR HIS ARRIVAL.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, SO YOU ARRIVED AT
THE HOUSE BEFORE HE GOT BACK --

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- FROM REHEARSAL?

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO MICHAEL HADN'T BEEN

BACK YET. YOU GOT THERE BEFORE HIM; IS THAT CORRECT?

DR. MURRAY: SURE, UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHAT TIME DID MICHAEL ARRIVE?

DR. MURRAY: SHORTLY AFTER. PROBABLY JUST MAYBE AROUND 1:00, 1:05.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: A.M. I CAN'T SAY EXACTLY WHAT

THE PRECISION OF TIME WOULD BE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ROUGHLY. THAT'S FINE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, ESTIMATION IS

GOOD.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND ONCE MICHAEL ARRIVES, WHAT TAKES PLACE?

DR. MURRAY: HE, I USUALLY ASKS -- HE SAID,
"GOOD NIGHT. HI. HOW ARE YOU?" AND I SAID THE SAME
TO HIM. AND THEN HE SAYS -- I SAID, "HOW WAS YOUR
DAY? ARE YOU FINE? WHAT ARE YOU FEELING?" AND HE
SAYS "OH, TIRED AND FATIGUED, AND I'M TREATED LIKE I'M
A MACHINE BECAUSE OF -- HE SAID THAT. BUT LET ME JUST
HAVE A QUICK SHOWER AND CHANGE, AND I'LL COME BACK TO
YOU."

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHAT TOOK PLACE NEXT?

DR. MURRAY: AFTER SHOWERING, SO HE CAME
BACK TO THE ROOM. AND HE WOULD -- I WOULD PUT ON SOME
CREAM ON HIS BODY FOR HIM, LOTION, ON AN AREA ON HIS
BACK.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT KIND OF CREAM WAS THIS?

DR. MURRAY: IT'S A CREAM THAT HE USES

FOR -- CHRONICALLY FOR DERMATOLOGICAL ISSUES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY. FOR WHAT?

DR. MURRAY: DERMATOLOGICAL ISSUES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: HE WALKS WITH AN UMBRELLA IN THE SUN. HE SAYS THAT HE IS -- HE HAS ALLERGIC REACTION TO THE SUN, WHICH PROBABLY STEM FROM A HISTORY OF VITILIGO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'S THE WHITE SPOTS?
DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHEN THIS WAS BEING

DONE, WAS THIS -- THERE'S TWO ROOMS WHEN YOU GO

UPSTAIRS, ONE IMMEDIATELY TO YOUR LEFT, WHICH I GUESS

WOULD HAVE BEEN MICHAEL'S, AND THEN THERE'S ANOTHER

ROOM WHERE THE I.V. DRIP WAS SET UP, IF YOU WILL -
DR. MURRAY: RIGHT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- AND ALL THE OXYGEN BOTTLES.

DR. MURRAY: RIGHT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WOULD THAT TYPICALLY BE YOUR ROOM?

DR. MURRAY: THAT WOULD BE THE ROOM WHERE I WOULD TYPICALLY SEE HIM. NO ONE WAS ALLOWED TO GO INTO THE OTHER ROOM TO THE LEFT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH.

DR. MURRAY: I ASKED HIM ABOUT THAT, AND TYPICALLY WHEREVER HE LIVED, HE ALWAYS HAD TWO SITES.

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FIRST OF ALL, HE DOES NOT TRUST PEOPLE COMING INTO HIS ROOM, BECAUSE HE SAID HE HAD LOST THINGS BEFORE. AND HIS ROOM IS ALWAYS IN A BAD STATE, AND NOT EVEN THE CLEANERS WOULD BE ALLOWED TO GO IN THERE. SO I NEVER WENT INTO THAT ROOM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHEN YOU WERE SEEING MICHAEL THIS NIGHT, PUTTING THIS CREAM ON HIM, WAS HE IN THE ROOM THAT YOU WOULD TYPICALLY STAY IN?

DR. MURRAY: YES, YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. ON THE BED?

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WAS ANYONE ELSE IN THE ROOM?

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO IT WAS JUST YOU AND MICHAEL. OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: USUALLY THAT'S HOW IT IS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND THIS NIGHT, IT WAS JUST YOU AND MICHAEL.

DR. MURRAY: JUST MYSELF AND HIM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO AFTER YOU PUT THIS CREAM ON HIM, WHAT TAKES PLACE? WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, THE USUAL THING IS THAT HE WANTS TO SLEEP.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND DOES HE GO TO SLEEP? DOES ANYTHING TAKE PLACE AFTER YOU PUT THE CREAM ON HIM AND --DR. MURRAY: NO, HE'S NOT ABLE TO SLEEP NATURALLY. DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO WHAT HAPPENS NEXT? DR. MURRAY: SO BASICALLY I WOULD PUT AN · I.V. DETECTIVE SMITH: IS THAT FOR DEHYDRATION OR --DR. MURRAY: HYDRATION AS WELL, BECAUSE, YOU KNOW, WHEN HE EXERCISES AND DANCES, HE LOSES A LOT OF FLUID. DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO THIS EVENING, YOU PUT THE I.V. IN? DR. MURRAY: YES. DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH. DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHAT HAPPENED NEXT? DR. MURRAY: WE TALKED A LITTLE BIT, AND THEN I GAVE HIM MEDICATION TO HELP HIM SLEEP.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. WHEN YOU PUT THE I.V. IN HIS ARM?

DR. MURRAY: NO, THE I.V. IS PLACED ON --

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VALIUM, DO YOU KNOW EXACTLY WHAT IT WAS?

DR. MURRAY: VALIUM. WHAT, THE DOSE?

DETECTIVE SMITH: 10 MILLIGRAMS?

DR. MURRAY: 10 MILLIGRAM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: ONE TABLET, UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ANYTHING ELSE?

DR. MURRAY: THAT'S WHAT HE TOOK ORALLY.

AND THEN HE SAT THERE. THE EFFECTS OF VALIUM ARE DELAYED. IT DOES NOT COME UP IMMEDIATELY. AND HE NEEDED TO SLEEP. SO THEN I GAVE HIM ADDITIONAL MEDICATIONS SAFELY, WHICH WAS THE I.V. FORM OF

DETECTIVE SMITH: DORAZEPAM?

DR. MURRAY: LO. LORAZEPAM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: LORAZEPAM?

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH. L-O-R-A-Z-A-P-E-M.

DETECTIVE SMITH: E-P-E-M?

DR. MURRAY: L-O-R-A-Z-E-P-A-M, LORAZEPAM.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IS THAT MEASURED IN

MILLIMETERS?

LORAZEPAM.

DR. MURRAY: MILLIGRAMS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: MILLIGRAMS?

DR. MURRAY: PER ML.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DO YOU REMEMBER HOW

MUCH YOU GAVE HIM?

DR. MURRAY: YES. THE CONCENTRATION THAT IT

CAME IN WAS 4 MILLIGRAMS PER ML IN THE VIAL, AND THE

VIAL THEN CARRIES 10 CC. SO I GAVE HIM HALF A

MILLIGRAM, EQUIVALENT TO 2 MILLIGRAMS TOTAL, AND I

DILUTED THAT UP WITH NORMAL SALINE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO THE TOTAL

AFTER YOU DILUTED WAS ABOUT HALF A MILLIGRAM; IS THAT

CORRECT?

DR. MURRAY: 2 MILLI -- 2 MILLIGRAMS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, 2 MILLIGRAMS.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. BECAUSE I ONLY TOOK HALF A MILLIGRAM, HALF OF -- HALF WAS -- HALF A CC, AND EACH CC CARRIES 4 MILLIGRAMS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO 2 MILLIGRAMS AFTER DILUTION.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WAS THAT PUT INTO HIS DRIP, HIS I.V., OR --

DR. MURRAY: NO, THAT --

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- WAS IT ANOTHER SITE?

DR. MURRAY: NO, THAT WAS PUSHED SLOWLY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY?

DR. MURRAY: IT WAS I.V. PUSHED SLOWLY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. INTO -- INTO HIS I.V. DRIP ALREADY.

DR. MURRAY: NO. THE I.V. DRIP WAS WITH THE SALINE, NORMAL SALINE FOR HYDRATION. AND LOWER DOWN ON THE -- ON THE CORD, THERE IS A PORT THAT I CAN INJECT A NEEDLE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: SO I WOULD TURN OFF THE I.V. AT THAT TIME, AND THEN I WOULD SLOWLY INFUSE THE MEDICATION.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: OVER ABOUT TWO TO THREE MINUTES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND ONCE THAT WAS SAFELY INFUSED, THEN I WOULD UNCLAP -- UNCAP THE LINE AND THEN JUST HAVE THE I.V. CONTINUE TO DRIP.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO OBVIOUSLY THAT WAS DONE WITH A SYRINGE.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SLOWLY.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, I WATCHED HIM. I
OBSERVED HIM, AND HE CONTINUED TO BE AWAKE FOR MORE
THAN AN HOUR.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ANY ADDITIONAL

MEDICATIONS?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, I WATCHED HIM BECAUSE,
YOU KNOW, I WANT TO BE CAUTIOUS. SO I WATCHED HIM
LONG ENOUGH TO SEE IF THERE WAS AN EFFECT OF DRUGS,
YOU KNOW, AS IF HE'D START TO SLEEP. AND AFTER AN
HOUR OR SO OF WATCHING HIM, HE WAS STILL WIDE AWAKE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DIDN'T WORK.

DR. MURRAY: DIDN'T CHANGE. HE CONTINUED TO COMPLAIN ABOUT HE CANNOT SLEEP. AND SO AFTER AN HOUR, I DECIDE "WELL, OKAY. I'M GOING TO GIVE HIM A DIFFERENT AGENT," BECAUSE HE IS WIDE AWAKE, AND AFTER AN HOUR, THE FULL EFFECTS OF THE MEDICATION BY THIS TIME IS SEEN. SO I GAVE HIM SOMETHING CALLED MIDAZOLAM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: HOW DO WE SPELL THAT, DOCTOR?

DR. MURRAY: M-I-D-A-Z-O-L-A-M.
M-I-D-A-Z-O-L-A-M.

MR. CHERNOFF: IT HAS A -- IT HAS A PRODUCT NAME.

DR. MURRAY: VERSED.

MR. CHERNOFF: VERSED?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, V-E-R-S-E-D, UH-HUH. V-E-R-S-E-D.

GUESSING -- AROUND 2:00 O'CLOCK.

MR. CHERNOFF: SO AN HOUR AFTER THAT.

DR. MURRAY: AN HOUR AFTER THAT, WHICH WAS

WITH THE --

MR. CHERNOFF: VERSED.

DR. MURRAY: -- VERSED.

MR. CHERNOFF: ALL RIGHT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ABOUT 3:00, 3:00 IN THE MORNING.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. HOW DID THAT WORK OUT?

DR. MURRAY: I WAITED AGAIN. AND IT DIDN'T WORK. HE WAS WIDE AWAKE. I SAID, "DO YOU FEEL A LITTLE BIT DROWSY? DO YOU THINK YOUR EYES ARE TELLING YOU YOU WANT TO SLEEP?" HE SAID, "NO." I SAID, "HOW ABOUT IF YOU TRY TO MEDITATE? LET'S CHANGE THE LIGHTING OF THE ROOM. LET'S LOWER THE MUSIC" THAT HE LIKES TO SLEEP WITH, WHICH IS LOUD, "LET ME -- I'LL RUB YOUR FEET. AND TRY TO RELAX. TRY TO MEDITATE." HE DID THAT RELUCTANTLY. AND HIS EYES CLOSED. I WAS GRATEFUL FOR THAT. SO I WATCHED HIM FOR ABOUT 15 --

DETECTIVE SMITH: DO YOU KNOW WHAT TIME IT WAS WHEN HE KIND OF FINALLY DRIFTED OFF?

DR. MURRAY: AFTER I GAVE HIM THE
MEDICATION? ABOUT ANOTHER 15, 20 MINUTES DURING MY
WAITING PERIOD, I WOULD SAY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO APPROXIMATELY 3:20,
3:30 IN THE MORNING NOW OR -- AND I'M JUDGING THAT -DR. MURRAY: YEAH, YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- AFTER YOU'D GIVEN THE VERSED.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. WELL, I GAVE HIM ABOUT 3:00 O'CLOCK. ANYWHERE FROM ABOUT 3:15, 3:20 OR SO WOULD BE A REASONABLE TIME. THAT'S WHAT I WOULD GUESSTIMATE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: I'M NOT WATCHING MY WATCH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SURE, NATURALLY.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. AND TALKING TO HIM ABOUT MEDITATING DURING THAT TIME AND TRYING TO RELAX HIMSELF AND TRYING TO SLEEP NATURALLY. I WAS SO (UNINTELLIGIBLE) THAT DURING THOSE 20 MINUTES OR SO, FROM 3:00 O'CLOCK TO THE TIME. AND THEN HIS EYES CLOSED, AND HE FELL ASLEEP. THAT, I TIMED, BECAUSE THAT WAS REALLY GREAT. AND AS I LOOKED AT MY WATCH AND I KEPT LOOKING AT HIM, WITHIN 10 MINUTES OR SO, 12 MINUTES, HE JUST JUMP RIGHT BACK UP.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WOKE UP AGAIN.

DR. MURRAY: WIDE AWAKE.

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DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HE FELL ASLEEP FOR ABOUT 10, 15 MINUTES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH.

DR. MURRAY: YOU KNOW? AND HE SAID, "WOW." HE SAID, "AFTER YOU ASKED ME TO MEDITATE, I NEVER THOUGHT IT WOULD WORK, BUT I GUESS I SLEPT A LITTLE BIT, DIDN'T I?" I SAID, "YOU DID. SO LET'S KEEP TRYING THAT." AND WE TRIED. AND 4:00 O'CLOCK CAME, AND 4:00 O'CLOCK WENT, AND HE STILL WAS STILL AWAKE. IT WAS 4:30 IN THE MORNING, AND HE WAS WIDE AWAKE. AND THEN HE COMPLAINED, "I GOT TO SLEEP, DR. CONRAD. I HAVE THESE REHEARSALS TO PERFORM. I MUST BE READY FOR THE SHOW IN ENGLAND. AND TOMORROW I WILL HAVE TO CANCEL MY PERFORMANCE. I HAVE TO CANCEL MY TRIP, BECAUSE, YOU KNOW, I CANNOT FUNCTION IF I DON'T GET THE SLEEP." I SAID, "WELL, I WANT YOU TO TRY. TRY, YOU KNOW. SO YOU HAVE TO CLOSE YOUR EYES." YOU KNOW, SO I START WORKING AGAIN. HE TRIED TO CLOSE HIS EYES, AND NOTHING WOULD WORK. HE IS MOVING HIS FEET, MOVING IN BED, COMPLAINING ABOUT "OH, I JUST CAN'T SLEEP. THE MEDICINE DOESN'T WORK." SO THEN I LOOKED AT MY WATCH, AND I REALIZED, WELL, SINCE I GAVE HIM THE ATIVAN, THE LORAZEPAM EARLIER, WHICH WAS ABOUT, WHAT, 2:00 O'CLOCK?

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DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: UH-HUH.

DR. MURRAY: (UNINTELLIGIBLE.) AND NOW WE ARE PAST 4:00, 4:30, HEADING INTO 5:00 O'CLOCK. HE HAS GOTTEN A SECOND AGENT. I DECIDED, WELL, IT IS RELATIVELY REASONABLE TO GIVE AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT OF THE -- OF THE LORAZEPAM.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO --

DR. MURRAY: THE ATIVAN. SO I GAVE HIM ANOTHER 2 MILLIGRAMS SLOWLY, AFTER ABOUT TWO AND A HALF HOURS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND THIS IS AN ADDITIONAL 2 MILLIGRAMS?

DR. MURRAY: YES. NOT OF -- NOT OF THE VERSED. OF THE LORAZEPAM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: LORAZEPAM?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. IT WAS THE FIRST AGENT I GAVE AT 2:00 O'CLOCK.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: THE OTHER NAME FOR LORAZEPAM IS ATIVAN, A-T-I-V-A-N, IF IT MIGHT HELP YOU. A-T-I-V-A-N.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND I'M SORRY. WHAT TIME WAS THIS NOW WHEN YOU --

DR. MURRAY: CLOSE TO 5:00 O'CLOCK.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ABOUT 5:00 O'CLOCK?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. IT WAS PAST 4:30 LIKE, YOU KNOW? AND HE WAS WIDE AWAKE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DID THAT HELP HIM RELAX
AND --

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NO?

DR. MURRAY: AT THAT TIME, HE COMPLAINED

THAT HE COULDN'T PERFORM; HE'LL HAVE TO CANCEL

REHEARSALS AGAIN; IT WILL PUT THE SHOW BEHIND; AND HE

WOULD JUST -- HE WOULD, YOU KNOW, NOT SATISFY HIS FANS

IF HE WASN'T RESTED WELL AND ALL OF THOSE THINGS. SO

THERE WAS A LOT OF PRESSURE PLACED ON ME THERE. AND I

TOLD HIM. I SAID, "YOU KNOW, IF I GOT THE MEDICINE

THAT I GAVE YOU, I'D BE SLEEPING UNTIL TOMORROW

EVENING, A NORMAL PERSON'S WAY. YOU ARE NOT NORMAL."

I TOLD HIM THAT. AND THEN I WAITED, WAITED AGAIN.

DAYLIGHT CAME UPON US. MR. JACKSON WAS STILL --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: STILL WHAT?

DR. MURRAY: STILL AWAKE, STILL TALKING.

DETECTIVE SMITH: 6:00, 6:30 NOW?

DR. MURRAY: OH, YES. STILL SLEEP. 7:30, MR. JACKSON IS STILL WIDE AWAKE. AT THAT TIME, I GIVE HIM ANOTHER 2 MILLIGRAMS OF THE VERSED, NOT LORAZEPAM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. NOW, YOU GAVE HIM 2
MILLIGRAMS -- I'M SORRY -- OF WHAT?

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DR. MURRAY: OF VERSED, V-E-R-S-E-D.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DID YOU DO IT THE SAME WAY, WHERE YOU DILUTED IT?

DR. MURRAY: YES. AND THEN SLOWLY INFUSED. VERSED IS THE SAME AS, AGAIN, MIDAZOLAM. OKAY? M-I-D-A-Z-O-L-A-M. HE HAD IT BEFORE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: I DID NOT CHANGE MEDICATION. DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: SO BETWEEN THE HOURS OF THE FIRST DOSE OF VERSED, WHICH WAS ABOUT SOMETIME LIKE 4:00 O'CLOCK, I THINK, IN THE MORNING. I JUST --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ABOUT 3:00 O'CLOCK.

DR. MURRAY: 3:00 O'CLOCK? THEN THERE IT WAS PAST 7:30, AND NO EFFECT. THAT'S WHEN I GAVE HIM THE OTHER DOSE, HOPING THAT HE WOULD GET SOME SLEEP. AND IT DID NOT WORK.

DETECTIVE SMITH: STILL NO EFFECT.

DR. MURRAY: NO EFFECT. I THEN -- I THEN CAUTIOUSLY CHECKED THE I.V. SITE. I CHECKED THE SITE OF INFUSION ON HIS BODY TO MAKE SURE THE I.V. WAS FLOWING INTO HIM AND IT WAS NOT WETTING THE BEDSHEETS. SO I MEAN -- I MEAN WHERE IS THIS MEDICINE GOING? WHY IS THIS MAN NOT RESPONDING?

DETECTIVE SMITH: HE'S AWAKE.

DR. MURRAY: WIDE AWAKE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: STILL AWAKE.

DR. MURRAY: WIDE AWAKE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND HE STILL HADN'T

URINATED, NOTHING?

DR. MURRAY: HE URINATED THEN. I MADE HIM
STAND AND HAD HIM URINATE, AND HE FILLED A -- HE HAD A
BAG ON HIM. AND THAT WAS FILLED, AND I EMPTIED THAT.
THEN I FILLED ANOTHER PORTABLE JUG, WHICH HE PLACED
ANOTHER 6, 700 CC'S IN OF URINE. SO HE URINATED,
YEAH. OH, YEAH, HE DOESN'T -- BECAUSE HE'S GETTING
THE I.V. FLUID, YOU KNOW, WHICH IS ALSO HYDRATING HIM.
DETECTIVE SMITH: NOW WE'RE BEYOND 7:30.

YOU'VE ADMINISTERED TWO MORE MILLIGRAMS OF THE VERSED.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: THERE WAS STILL NO EFFECT.

DR. MURRAY: NO EFFECT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: IT'S GETTING LATER NOW.

WHAT -- WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

DR. MURRAY: NOW WE ARE -- WE ARE BEYOND 10:00 O'CLOCK IN THE MORNING.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND NOTHING HAS WORKED.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BUT BETWEEN THE 7:30 AND THE 10:00, THERE'S -- YOU'RE JUST WATCHING HIM AND

TELLING HIM TO MEDITATE.

DR. MURRAY: WE'RE TRYING, TRYING. AND NOW HE'S REALLY COMPLAINING THAT HE CANNOT SLEEP; YOU KNOW, WHAT I'M DOING ISN'T WORKING; AND HE HAS TO CANCEL THE DAY, CANCEL REHEARSAL; EVERYTHING IS GOING TO BE THROWN OFF, THROWN BACK; AND WE HAVE VERY LITTLE TIME TO TAKE THE SHOW TO ENGLAND. AT THAT TIME, HE SAID, "I'D LIKE TO HAVE SOME MILK."

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: MILK?

DETECTIVE SMITH: ABOUT WHAT TIME WAS THIS?

DR. MURRAY: THIS, HE SAID, "PLEASE, PLEASE

GIVE ME SOME MILK SO THAT I CAN SLEEP, BECAUSE I KNOW

THAT THIS IS ALL THAT REALLY WORKS FOR ME."

DETECTIVE SMITH: HOT MILK OR WARM OR

JUST --

DR. MURRAY: IT'S JUST SOME MEDICINE -DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT --

DR. MURRAY: -- THAT HE WAS FAMILIAR WITH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHAT IS THE MEDICINE?

DR. MURRAY: IT'S CALLED PROPOFOL.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: PROPOFOL. OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO HOW DO WE SPELL THAT,

DOCTOR?

DR. MURRAY: P-R-O-P-O-F-O-L.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHAT IS THIS PROPOFOL?

DR. MURRAY: IT IS A SEDATIVE THAT COULD

ALSO BE USED FOR ANESTHESIA.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND HOW IS THAT -- IS IT INJECTED AS WELL?

DR. MURRAY: IT IS BOTH GIVEN IN INTRAVENOUS FORM. USUALLY MOST PATIENTS ARE GIVEN A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF THE DRUG BASED UPON BODY WEIGHT, AND THEN THEY CAN BE STARTED WITH AN INFUSION SLOW ENOUGH TO KEEP THEM -- THE LEVELS IN THE PLASMA UP SO THAT WE CAN -- THEY CAN SLEEP.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO YOU GAVE HIM THIS PROPOFOL.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DO YOU REMEMBER ABOUT WHAT TIME IT WAS NOW? THE LAST TIME I GOT WAS ABOUT 10:00 O'CLOCK, WHEN THERE WAS STILL NO EFFECT AND HE'S COMPLAINING THAT HE'S GOING TO HAVE TO CANCEL.

DR. MURRAY: IT WAS -- I KNEW I LOOKED AT THE TIME. I LOOKED AT THE SUN. AND IT WAS -- IT WAS -- I SAW 10:30. SO I WOULD SAY ROUGHLY 10:40.

MR. CHERNOFF: WHY DID YOU LOOK AT THE TIME?

DR. MURRAY: BECAUSE I'M LOOKING AT THE TIME

FROM THE TIME I STARTED TREATING HIM AND ALL THAT I

HAVE GIVEN HIM TO THIS POINT, WAITING FOR THE EFFECT

AND EVERYTHING ELSE, AND I'M NOT SEEING ANY EFFECT.

AND I LOOKED AT THE TIME, BECAUSE I ALSO KNOW THAT IF

HIS DAY IS TO BE PRODUCTIVE, HE ALSO HAS TO GET UP BY

A CERTAIN TIME.

AND IF HE -- IF -- AND AS HE AND I SPOKE

OPENLY AND HE WAS -- AND THERE'S NO SEDATIVE EFFECT

FROM THE ONE THAT HE RECEIVED SO FAR, I SAID, "IF YOU

GOT PROPOFOL NOW," WHICH, OF COURSE, HE REFERRED TO AS

THE MILK, "HOW MUCH TIME -- HOW MUCH SLEEP YOU EXPECT

TO HAVE? YOU KNOW, YOU GOING TO BE NEEDED TO BE UP NO

LATER THAN NOON." AND HE SAID, "JUST MAKE ME SLEEP.

DOESN'T MATTER WHAT TIME I GET UP."

I SAID, "WHAT WILL HAPPEN TO YOU? YOUR REHEARSAL IS ALREADY SCHEDULED FOR TODAY." HE SAID, "I CAN'T FUNCTION IF I DON'T SLEEP. THEY'LL HAVE TO CANCEL IT. AND I DON'T WANT THEM TO CANCEL IT, BUT THEY WILL HAVE TO CANCEL IT." SO I -- I AGREED AT THAT TIME THAT I WOULD SWITCH THE -- OVER TO THE PROPOFOL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: THIS IS THE FIRST TIME NOW THAT YOU'RE USING THIS.

DR. MURRAY: FIRST TIME, YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND I WOULD GIVE HIM A SMALL AMOUNT THAT WOULD HELP HIM TO SLEEP AND THEN SEE IF

THE EFFECT WOULD BE THERE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: HOW MUCH DID YOU

ADMINISTER INITIALLY?

DR. MURRAY: 25 MILLIGRAMS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND AGAIN, THIS WAS APPROXIMATELY 10:40 NOW, GIVE OR TAKE?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, BY 10:40, WE -- WE HAVE DISCUSSED THAT NOTHING IS HAPPENING. SO BY THE TIME I WITHDRAW IT FROM THE BOTTLE, GET IT DILUTED -- I HAD TO DILUTE IT, AND USUALLY I DILUTE IT WITH LIDOCAINE, L-I-D-O-C-A-I-N-E, BECAUSE IT COULD BE VERY -- IT BURNS THE VESSELS. IN THE SENSE OF THE SIDE EFFECT, IT CAUSES IT TO BURN.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND I'M SORRY. YOU GAVE HIM HOW MUCH NOW?

DR. MURRAY: 25 MILLIGRAMS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND ALWAYS THE SAME

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: REGARDLESS OF WHAT YOU WERE GIVING HIM, WAS INTO THE --

DR. MURRAY: YES, I PUSHED IT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND I'M SORRY. I

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INTERRUPTED YOU, BUT WE WERE GETTING TOWARDS THE TIME AT 10:40, YOU REALIZED THAT NOTHING WAS HAPPENING, AND SO BY THE TIME YOU GOT YOUR THINGS TOGETHER AND YOU PUSHED IT, IT WAS --

DR. MURRAY: IT WOULDN'T TAKE A LONG TIME FOR ME TO JUST WITHDRAW FROM A VIAL AND DILUTE IT WITH THE LIDOCAINE, WHICH IS A LOCAL ANESTHETIC AGENT THAT, YOU KNOW, ALSO IS A SODIUM BLOCKER TO MAKE HIM NOT FEEL THE BURNING SENSATION OF THE SLOW INJECTION. SO I HAD A TOTAL OF MEDICATION MIXED WITH THE LIDOCAINE, AND I ADMINISTERED IT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. DOES THAT TAKE YOU ABOUT AN EXTRA 5 MINUTES OR 10 MINUTES?

DR. MURRAY: SLOWLY INFUSED. SLOWLY INFUSED OVER, I WOULD SAY, 3 TO 5 MINUTES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: 3 TO 5?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, BECAUSE THE EFFECT IS GONE VERY QUICKLY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO WE'RE LOOKING LIKE AT 10:50ISH.

DR. MURRAY: YES. YEAH, THE EFFECT IS GONE VERY QUICKLY. SO THE EFFECT WAS ONLY LAST -- ONLY LASTS ABOUT 15 MINUTES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO NOW WE'RE AT ROUGHLY 10:50, 11:00 O'CLOCK.

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT TAKES PLACE NEXT?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, YOU KNOW, HE'S NOW ASLEEP, YOU KNOW.

DETECTIVE SMITH: HE DOES GO TO SLEEP.

DR. MURRAY: HE NOW GOES TO SLEEP.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

MR. CHERNOFF: WERE YOU -- WHEN YOU DID
THIS, WHILE YOU WERE ADMINISTERING TO HIM, DID YOU
ACTUALLY HAVE ANY PRECAUTIONS THAT YOU TOOK,
MONITORING MACHINES OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT?

THAT WAS AVAILABLE TO ME. I -- SINCE I STARTED SEEING HIM, I MADE SURE THAT THERE WAS OXYGEN AT THE BEDSIDE, THAT HE WAS PLACED ON OXYGEN EVERY NIGHT VIA NASAL CANNULA AND PULSE OXIMETER, WHICH IS A PLASTIC TUBE THAT GOES OVER THE FINGER OR THE TOE. IT'S A DEVICE. IT IS BATTERY OPERATED. THAT SHOWS ME THE OXYGEN SATURATION LEVEL AND ALSO BEAT BY BEAT DYNAMICALLY SHOWS ME THE HEART RATE FOR THE PATIENT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YOU SAID PULSE OXIPETER?

DR. MURRAY: OXIMETER.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OXIMETER.

DR. MURRAY: O-X-I-M-E-T-E-R. THAT

REGISTERS THE AMOUNT OF OXYGEN THAT HE HAS IN HIS

BLOOD, AND IT ALSO HELPS ME TO LOOK AT THE HEART RATE.

SO THOSE THINGS ARE IN PLACE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: YOU WERE DOING IT THIS EVENING, THROUGHOUT THE NIGHT?

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: THIS PARTICULAR TIME?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH --

MR. CHERNOFF: AND YOU HAD -- HE HAD ASKED FOR THIS PARTICULAR DRUG, HIS --

DETECTIVE SMITH: REFERRED TO AS MILK.

MR. CHERNOFF: -- PROPOFOL. MILK

DR. MURRAY: MILK.

MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH, LET'S JUST CALL IT

MILK. HE HAD ASKED FOR THIS BEFORE, AND YOU KNEW HOW HE REACTED TO IT. YOU'D GIVEN IT TO HIM BEFORE.

DR. MURRAY: I'VE GIVEN IT TO HIM BEFORE.

MR. CHERNOFF: AND HE HANDLED IT FINE.

DR. MURRAY: HE HANDLED IT FINE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: THE SAME DOSE?

DR. MURRAY: THE DOSE AND THE DRIP. NOT THE SAME DOSE IN THIS CASE, BECAUSE I HAD GIVEN HIM EARLIER VERSED. I HAD GIVEN HIM THE ATIVAN AT DIFFERENT TIMES DURING THE NIGHT. AND I KNOW THAT

THEIR HALF-LIFE IS NOT AS SHORT AS LORAZEPAM. SO I

TOOK A PRECAUTION, KNOWING THAT THERE WAS POSSIBLE ALL

OF THE MEDICATIONS STILL ON BOARD. SO THE

25 MILLIGRAM ORDINARILY WOULD NOT BE A DOSE I WOULD

GIVE HIM IF HE DID NOT HAVE THOSE OTHER AGENTS ON

BOARD. I WOULD GIVE HIM A HIGHER DOSE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, OKAY. SO IT'S A LOWER DOSE THAN NORMAL.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT HAVE YOU -- WHAT'S THE HIGHEST AMOUNT OF MILK YOU'VE GIVEN HIM IN THE PAST?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, BASED --

DETECTIVE SMITH: IF THESE OTHER AGENTS WEREN'T IN HIM?

DR. MURRAY: BASED UPON HIS WEIGHT, IT WOULD BE WEIGHT BASED.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: UH-HUH.

DR. MURRAY: AND THE HIGHEST AMOUNT I'D GIVEN HIM INITIALLY, DIRECT ON THE I.V. BEFORE STARTING THE DRIP ON HIM, WOULD BE TWICE THAT AMOUNT, WHICH IS ABOUT 50 MILLIGRAMS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO IT WAS APPROXIMATELY HALF OF WHAT YOU'D GIVEN HIM BEFORE.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: BUT I HALVED THE DOSE HERE TO BE CAUTIOUS, AS THERE WERE OTHER MEDICATIONS GIVEN TO HIM DURING THE NIGHT, WHICH ALSO INDUCES SLEEP. AND HE HAD NO -- THERE WAS NO RESPONSE OR EFFECT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: CAN YOU RECALL OFF THE TOP OF YOUR HEAD APPROXIMATELY HOW MANY OTHER TIMES HE'S RECEIVED THIS MILK AND HANDLED IT FINE?

DR. MURRAY: WELL --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I'M SORRY. THAT YOU'VE GIVEN IT TO HIM, NOT THAT OTHER DOCTORS HAVE.

DR. MURRAY: I'VE GIVEN IT TO HIM --

MR. CHERNOFF: WAS IT MORE THAN TEN TIMES?

DR. MURRAY: YES.

MR. CHERNOFF: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: MUCH MORE THAN TEN TIMES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: MORE THAN -- WELL, HOW FAR
BACK WE GOING NOW, TIME SPAN WISE? IT WAS IN THE LAST
COUPLE OF MONTHS YOU WERE CONTACTED -- RIGHT? INITIALLY --

DR. MURRAY: TWO MONTHS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- BY AMIR FOR THIS TOUR.

DR. MURRAY: TWO MONTHS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO IN THE LAST COUPLE

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MONTHS --

DAY.

DR. MURRAY: TWO MONTHS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. YOU'VE ADMINISTERED IT MORE THAN TEN TIMES.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: MORE THAN 20 TIMES?

DR. MURRAY: 30 DAYS A MONTH ROUGHLY, EVERY

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO IT'S A DAILY -DETECTIVE SMITH: A DAILY

DR. MURRAY: DAILY, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THREE DAYS LEADING UP TO HIS DEATH. I TRIED TO WEAN HIM OFF --

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: -- THAT MEDICATION.

MR. CHERNOFF: AND LET'S -- LET'S BE CLEAR.

LET'S MAKE SURE THAT YOU GUYS ASK THIS QUESTION, IF

YOU DON'T MIND.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SURE.

MR. CHERNOFF: BEFORE YOU WERE HIRED ON AS HIS DOCTOR, WERE YOU AWARE THAT MICHAEL JACKSON WAS TAKING THIS ON A DAILY BASIS?

DR. MURRAY: I WAS NOT AWARE THAT MICHAEL

JACKSON WAS TAKING THIS ON A DAILY BASIS, BUT I WAS A
BIT SURPRISED OF HIS PHARMACOLOGICAL KNOWLEDGE,

BECAUSE THAT IS NOT AN AGENT THAT MOST PEOPLE PULL
THIS OUT FROM THEIR HAT. AND HE EXPLAINED TO ME THAT
HE HAD TAKEN IT MULTIPLE TIMES. HE USED IT FREQUENTLY
ON HIS TOURS. IT WAS GIVEN TO HIM BY MULTIPLE OTHER
DOCTORS.

HE KNEW EXACTLY THAT WE HAD TO HAVE

ANTIBURN. ANTIBURN WAS HIS WORD FOR THE LIDOCAINE,

BECAUSE HE SAID WHENEVER IT WAS INJECTED -- HE CALLED

IT ANTIBURN, WHICH WAS THE WORD FOR LIDOCAINE, BECAUSE
HE SAID WHENEVER IT WAS INJECTED INTO HIM OR IT WAS

RUNNING INTO HIM, INFUSING, IT WOULD SET HIS LIMB OR

WHEREVER ON FIRE.

AND HE ASKED ME IF I EVER HAD IT, AND I
SAID, "NO." AND HE SAID, "WELL, I AM JUST LETTING YOU
KNOW. WITHOUT THE ANTIBURN, IT'S REALLY
UNCOMFORTABLE. SO MAKE SURE THAT THERE IS ALWAYS A
LOT OF THAT AVAILABLE." BUT HE IS SPEAKING FROM A
SOURCE OF EXPERIENCE. AND HE ALSO SAID THAT HE HAD
USED IT IN GERMANY AND SEVERAL OTHER PLACES BUT NEVER
REALLY TRULY DISCLOSED THE DOCTOR'S NAME.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND THAT'S SOMETHING THAT YOU UNDERSTOOD THAT WAS ADMINISTERED BY A DOCTOR AND NOT MICHAEL HIMSELF, OR COULD IT --

DR. MURRAY: HE NEVER TOLD ME THAT HE ADMINISTERED IT HIMSELF, BUT HE HAD SAID TO ME THAT

THE DOCTORS ALLOWED HIM TO INFUSE IT HIMSELF. AND I REFUSED HIM THAT OPPORTUNITY. AND HE ASKED ME, "WHY WOULD YOU -- WHY DON'T YOU WANT ME TO PUSH IT? I LOVE TO PUSH IT. YOU KNOW, IT MAKES ME FEEL MEDICINE IS GREAT." I SAID, "WELL, IF I'M GOING TO GIVE YOU AN AGENT THAT IS GOING TO PUT YOU TO SLEEP IMMEDIATELY AND BE SO QUICK TO ACT, I DON'T WANT YOU EVER TO INFUSE SUCH A SUBSTANCE WHEN I'M PRESENT. I'LL DO THAT. SO SORRY ABOUT THE OTHER DOCTORS WHO HAVE DONE THIS. I WOULD NOT."

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO TO BE -- YOU KNOW, I KNOW WHAT THE ANSWER TO THIS QUESTION IS, BUT JUST TO -- SO I'M NOT ASSUMING. THE FIRST TIME THAT MILK WAS USED ON HIM, WAS IT YOUR IDEA OR WAS IT HIS IDEA?

DR. MURRAY: HIS. HIS.

MR. CHERNOFF: HE KNEW HOW MUCH TO PUT IN.
HE KNEW WHAT IT WAS. HE KNEW HOW TO INJECT IT. HE
KNEW ALL THAT.

DR. MURRAY: YES. AND HE ALSO -- AND HE KNEW THAT THAT WAS THE ONLY THING THAT WORKED FOR HIM. NOW, I CONSTANTLY CAUTIONED HIM THAT THAT IS AN ARTIFICIAL WAY TO GO TO SLEEP. IT WOULD BE NICE TO GET HIM BACK TO A MORE PHYSIOLOGICAL STATE. LIKE MOST PEOPLE, WHEN THEY WORK AND THEY'RE TIRED, THEY FALL

ASLEEP.

AND HE ASKED ME. HE SAID, "COULD YOU SLEEP LIKE THAT?" AND I SAID, "NO DOUBT ABOUT IT. YOU KNOW, MOST PEOPLE COULD SLEEP. I DO UNDERSTAND THAT CHILDREN HAVE A BETTER SLEEPING HABIT FOR REM SLEEP THAN ADULTS. AND AS WE GROW OLDER, WE DON'T SLEEP AS WELL AND AS LONG. AND SOMETIME PATIENTS NEEDED HELP, SEDATIVE THAT THEY WILL USE AS NEEDED. AND THAT'S OKAY." BUT I SAID TO DO THIS ON THAT FREQUENCY, I DID NOT -- I TRIED TO COUNSEL HIM AWAY FROM THAT.

MR. CHERNOFF: DO YOU HAPPEN TO KNOW -- I'M SORRY TO INTERRUPT, GUYS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'S FINE.

MR. CHERNOFF: DO YOU HAPPEN TO KNOW WHO HIS DOCTOR WAS -- WAS ANY NAME GIVEN OF A DOCTOR BEFORE YOU WERE HIRED ON?

DR. MURRAY: YES. MIND YOU, HE NEVER -- HE TOLD ME THAT THERE WERE A COUPLE DOCTORS IN GERMANY AND THEY WOULD HIGH-FIVE EACH OTHER AND DO DIFFERENT THINGS BASED UPON THE SUBSTANCES THAT HE GOT. BUT PRIOR TO STARTING WITH HIM IN MAY, HE CAME TO VEGAS SOMETIME IN -- IT WAS IN MARCH OR APRIL, I WOULD SAY.

MR. CHERNOFF: DID HE -- I GUESS THE POINT I'M TRYING TO MAKE IS DID HE TELL YOU -- LET'S JUST GET DOWN TO THIS DR. LEE.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, LET'S GET ON.

MR. CHERNOFF: THIS DR. LEE DEAL, WHERE YOU ASKED HIM ABOUT SOME THINGS THAT WERE -- THESE MARKS THAT WERE ON HIS -- ON HIS FEET ALREADY.

OF I.V. SITES. AND HE HAD VEINS THAT WERE SCLEROTIC.

SO I ASKED HIM WHAT WAS HE GETTING. AND HE TOLD ME

THAT HE WAS SEEING A DR. LEE, WHO WAS GIVING HIM A

SPECIAL COCKTAIL FOR FLUSHING HIS BODY AND SUPPOSED TO

GIVE ENERGY. AND DR. LEE HAD STATED THAT SHE -- NEVER

MET HER -- THAT SHE WORKED WITH THE LAKERS DURING THE

TIMES THEY WON THE CHAMPIONSHIP, AND HER COCKTAIL WAS

SO GOOD FOR GIVING THE TEAM ENERGY.

AND I SAID, "WELL, WHAT'S IN THE COCKTAIL?"

HE SAID, "I DON'T KNOW," BUT HE REMEMBERED ONE NAME,

WHICH I THINK WAS METHIONINE. I DON'T REMEMBER, BUT I

KNOW IT WAS AN AMINO ACID IN THERE. AND I SAID,

"WELL, COULD YOU FIND FROM DR. LEE EXACTLY WHAT THE

COCKTAIL IS? BECAUSE I'D LIKE TO REVIEW IT. I'M NOT

SURE IF IT'S GOOD FOR YOU, BECAUSE I'M FINDING THAT AS

YOUNG AS YOU ARE, YOUR VEINS ARE ALL BEING SCLEROTIC."

HIS VEINS ARE BECOMING CLOTS, LIKE FILLED WITH CLOTS AND DRIED UP. AND YOU CANNOT BARELY FIND SITES FOR AN I.V. THAT'S WHY YOU HAVE TO SEE ME LOOKING FOR SOMETHING ON HIS LEG OR SOMETHING LIKE

THAT. HIS HANDS ARE ALL SCLEROTIC FROM TOO MUCH USE OF I.V. OVER TIME.

THEN HE TOLD ME THAT AFTER A WHILE -- HE

NEVER GOT ME THE INFORMATION, BUT HE DID TELL ME -
WHEN I JOINED HIM REGULARLY, I SAID, "WHAT'S THE STORY

WITH YOU AND DR. LEE, AND WHAT'S HAPPENING?" HE SAID,

"OH, WE GOT RID OF HER." I SAID, "WHAT HAPPENED?" HE

SAID, "WELL, SHE WAS UNPROFESSIONAL." I SAID, "WHY

WAS SHE UNPROFESSIONAL?" HE SAID SHE JUST CALLED ONE

DAY WHEN HE WAS EXPECTING HER: SHE SAID HER CHILD HAD

GOTTEN SICK AND SHE HAD TAKEN HIM TO THE URGENT CARE

AND SHE COULDN'T MAKE IT. SO SHE DIDN'T COME.

I SAID, "WELL, THAT'S REASONABLE. YOU KNOW, YOU HAVE CHILDREN, TOO. AND THAT COULD BE REAL." BUT HE FELT THAT THE DOCTOR DID NOT TELL HIM THE TRUTH.

SO HE WAS UPSET AND TOLD HER NOT TO COME BACK. I

BELIEVE SHE WAS NOT SEEN AGAIN. THAT'S DR. LEE. SO I

DON'T KNOW EXACTLY WHAT WAS IN HER COCKTAIL, BUT SHE

WAS GIVING HIM --

MR. CHERNOFF: OR IF THERE WAS A COCKTAIL.

DR. MURRAY: WHATEVER. BUT SHE'LL GIVE HIM SOME I.V.

MR. CHERNOFF: ALL RIGHT.

DR. MURRAY: SEVERAL TIMES A WEEK.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WAS THIS IN

LAS VEGAS?

I

DR. MURRAY: NO, THIS WAS HERE LOCALLY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO THAT WAS WITHIN THE LAST SIX MONTHS?

DR. MURRAY: YES. NOW, THE REASON I MENTION THAT IS BECAUSE I WANTED TO GIVE YOU ANOTHER NAME OF DR. ADAMS, BECAUSE YOU ASKED ABOUT THE MILK.

MR. CHERNOFF: OH, THAT'S RIGHT.

DR. MURRAY: DOCTOR --

MR. CHERNOFF: HE MENTIONED THAT MICHAEL MENTIONED A DR. ADAMS THAT ACTUALLY WAS IN VEGAS; RIGHT?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, YEAH. DAVID ADAMS.
MR. CHERNOFF: OKAY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHAT ABOUT DR.

DR. MURRAY: I NEVER KNEW MICHAEL JACKSON
WAS COMING TO TOWN. AND AGAIN, NOT KNOWING THAT, I

DON'T KEEP A RECORD OF HIS TIME, BUT IT WAS SOMETIME BETWEEN MARCH AND APRIL. AND HE CALLED ME. AND I SAID, "HI. HOW YOU DOING, MICHAEL? WHERE ARE YOU?"

AND HE SAYS, "OH, I'M IN VEGAS."

"REALLY? WHY HERE?"

"I BROUGHT MY CHILDREN TO SEE A SHOW."

I SAID, "WOW. WELL, THAT'S NICE." I CAN'T

REMEMBER WHAT SHOW HE WAS SEEING. AND I SAID, "WHEN ARE YOU LEAVING?" HE SAYS, "I'M LEAVING TOMORROW."

SO HE WAS JUST HERE FOR ONE NIGHT. HE STAYED AT THE WYNN HOTEL. AND THEN AFTER SPEAKING WITH HIM, I HUNG UP.

THEN I GOT ANOTHER CALL FROM HIS ASSISTANT,
MICHAEL AMIR. AND HE SAID MR. JACKSON WANTS TO SPEAK
TO ME AGAIN. SO I SPOKE WITH HIM. AND THEN HE ASKED
ME. HE SAYS "I'M HAVING DIFFICULTY SLEEPING. I CAN'T
SLEEP." BUT I SAID, "WELL, YOU'RE HERE JUST FOR A
NIGHT, A SHOW AND FILM. WHY YOU HAVING DIFFICULTY
SLEEPING? CAN'T YOU JUST SLEEP? YOU HAD A LONG TRIP
ON THE ROAD FROM L.A. TO LAS VEGAS. YOU KNOW, IF YOU
GO TO BED" -- I SAID, "ARE YOU GOING OUT TONIGHT AND
DOING ANYTHING?" HE SAID, "NO, I'M STAYING INSIDE.
BUT I JUST CAN'T SLEEP."

HE SAID, "COULD YOU HELP ME TO SLEEP?" I

SAID, "WELL, DON'T YOU HAVE ANY SLEEPING PILL THAT I

GAVE YOU IN THE PAST THAT YOU CAN USE AS NEEDED?"

LIKE -- LIKE LORAZEPAM OR RESTORIL, WHICH I HAD GIVEN

TO HIM BEFORE, PILL FORM. HE SAID, "THEY DON'T WORK."

I SAID, "DID YOU TRY THEM?" HE SAID, "YES,

DR. CONRAD. NOTHING WORKS. YOU KNOW, I'VE HAD PILLS

FROM THE OTHER DOCTORS IN BEVERLY HILLS, AND I'VE HAD

MEDICINE FROM DR. KLEIN, WHO SAYS HE GAVE ME THE

STRONGEST MEDICATION. AND I HAVE MEDICINE FROM DR. METZER, M-E-T-Z-E-R. THEY ALL DON'T WORK."

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DR. KLEIN, DR. METZER.

WAS THERE ANOTHER ONE?

DR. MURRAY: THOSE ARE THE NAMES THAT HE HAD MENTIONED. I SAID, "I DON'T HAVE ANYTHING I CAN OFFER YOU THAT WOULD WORK." HE SAID, "WELL, WHAT ABOUT DIPRIVAN?" WHICH IS ANOTHER NAME FOR -- WHICH IS THE -

MR. CHERNOFF: BRAND NAME FOR PROPOFOL.

DR. MURRAY: WHICH IS THE OTHER NAME --

DETECTIVE SMITH: FOR WHAT?

DR. MURRAY: DIPRIVAN, D-I-P-R-I-V-A-N, WHICH IS THE OTHER NAME FOR PROPOFOL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OH.

DR. MURRAY: WHICH IS THE MILK.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

MR. CHERNOFF: OH, YEAH, THE MILK.

DR. MURRAY: SO HE ASKED ME, "WHAT ABOUT DIPRIVAN?" I SAID, "DIPRIVAN? WHY YOU ASK THAT?" HE SAID, "WELL, IT WORKS. I KNOW IT WORKS." I SAID, "WELL, THAT'S NOT A MEDICINE YOU CAN JUST CALL AND READILY PUT YOUR HANDS ON. YOU KNOW, IT'S A MEDICINE THAT YOU'LL HAVE TO ORDER. AND I DON'T KNOW ANYWAY HOW I CAN GET THAT TO YOU."

SO HE SAID -- SO YOU CAN TELL HE GOT

RESTLESS. AND FRUSTRATION CAME UPON HIM BECAUSE I
COULDN'T SATISFY HIM. AND THEN HE SAID, "DO YOU KNOW
THIS DR. ADAMS? WHAT'S HIS NAME AGAIN? DR. ADAMS?
CAN'T REMEMBER HIS FIRST NAME." HE SAID, "HE'S A
BLACK DOCTOR. HE IS ABOUT YOUR HEIGHT. LOOKS LIKE A
FOOTBALL PLAYER. HE HAS MORE WEIGHT THAN YOU. AND
YOU KNOW, HE GAVE IT TO ME BEFORE IN LAS VEGAS SEVERAL
TIMES. AND YOU KNOW, HE WALKS WITH HIS LITTLE BAG."
THAT'S WHAT HE SAID.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DR. ADAMS GAVE HIM THE MILK BEFORE?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. DAVID ADAMS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. I'M SORRY.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. SO I SAID, "WELL, I
CAN'T HELP YOU, BECAUSE I DON'T HAVE ACCESS TO SUCH
PRODUCTS. AND THOSE HAS -- THOSE HAVE TO BE ORDERED,
AND THIS IS THE WEEKEND, A SUNDAY." SO HE SAID, "YOU
DON'T KNOW HIM?" I SAID, "NO."

"DO YOU HAVE HIS NUMBER?"

I SAID, "I DON'T KNOW HIM. SO I DON'T HAVE
A NUMBER." HE SAID, "WELL, I THINK I CAN CALL BROTHER
MICHAEL," WHICH IS MR. AMIR. HE SAID, "LET ME CALL
HIM BECAUSE HE HAS THE NUMBER. SO I'LL CALL YOU
BACK."

SO WITHIN FIVE MINUTES TO TEN MINUTES, I GOT

ANOTHER CALL BACK FROM MR. JACKSON HIMSELF. AND HE SAID, "THIS IS THE NUMBER, AND THIS IS HIS NAME, MR. ADAMS. COULD YOU ASK HIM IF HE CAN HELP ME TO SLEEP? IF YOU CAN FIND HIM, AS A DOCTOR TO A DOCTOR, COULD YOU CALL HIM?" SO I MADE THAT CALL. IT WAS ABOUT -- THIS IS SUNDAY, THE DAY HE'S SUPPOSED TO BE GOING BACK TO LOS ANGELES. AND THIS IS LIKE 2:00 O'CLOCK IN THE DAY. AND I THOUGHT HE'D BE ON THE ROAD BY NOW.

HE SAID MR. ADAMS -- HE SAID, "HE HELPED ME BEFORE. HE WOULD TAKE ME TO THIS PLASTIC SURGEON'S OFFICE. AND HE WILL COME THERE WITH HIS BAG, AND HE ALWAYS HAD IT, AND HE WOULD START IT," AND HE WOULD GET SLEEP. I SAID, "WHAT IS THE SURGEON'S NAME?" HE MENTIONED THE NAME, BUT I DON'T KNOW THE SURGEON EITHER. SO HE SAID HE IS GOING TO MAKE A CALL TO THE SURGEON TO SEE IF DR. ADAMS IS AVAILABLE, IF HE COULD COME THERE TO HELP HIM. HE WOULD GO ANYWHERE WHERE IT WAS NECESSARY.

SO I SAID, "OKAY. GO MAKE YOUR CALL." AND THE CALL IS MADE, AND WHAT I WAS TOLD BY MR. JACKSON IS THAT MICHAEL AMIR SAID THE SURGEON -- OR THE COSMETOLOGIST, I THINK HE IS, SAID THAT TODAY HE WASN'T GOING TO LET THEM USE HIS OFFICE UNLESS MR. JACKSON AGREED TO HAVE SOME OTHER COSMETOLOGIAL --

COSMETOLOGICAL PROCEDURE.

MR. CHERNOFF: (UNINTELLIGIBLE.)

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, WHICH, OF COURSE, HE WOULD BE ABLE TO GET PAID FOR FOR USING HIS PREMISES, AND AT THE SAME TIME HE COULD BE ASLEEP WHILE HE IS DOING HIS THING. SO I TOLD HIM THE DOCTOR SAID IF HE WASN'T GOING TO MAKE ANY MONEY FOR A PROCEDURE, THEN HE WASN'T GOING TO HAVE IT DONE.

I DID CALL DR. ADAMS, DAVID ADAMS. I TOLD HIM THAT I HAD NEVER MET HIM. MR. JACKSON SAID THAT HE HAD WORKED WITH HIM BEFORE, THAT HE HAD GIVEN HIM DIPRIVAN TO SLEEP, AND HE WANTED TO KNOW IF HE WAS AVAILABLE TO HELP. DR. ADAMS SAID TO ME, "GIVE HIM ONE HOUR, AND HE'LL CALL ME BACK."

I CALLED MR. JACKSON. I SAID, "I SPOKE TO MR. ADAMS, DR. ADAMS. HE TOLD ME THAT HE MAY HAVE ENOUGH OF THE PRODUCT THAT YOU WANT." HE'S QUITE FAMILIAR WITH HIM, BECAUSE DR. ADAMS SAID TO ME, "OH, YEAH, I KNOW MICHAEL. I KNOW MICHAEL VERY WELL. HE ALWAYS -- HE DOES WELL ON DIPRIVAN. HE LOVES THAT DRUG."

DETECTIVE SMITH: MILK.

DR. MURRAY: MILK. HE DID NOT CALL IT MILK.

HE JUST SAID, "HE LOVES THAT DRUG." MILK WAS ADOPTED

LATER ON. WHEN I STARTED TO WORK WITH HIM, I GUESS,

HE STARTED TO CALL IT MILK AND ANTIBURN.

SO MR. ADAMS CANNOT GET THE COSMETOLOGIST TO OPEN HIS PRACTICE. SO I ALLOWED HIM ON A SUNDAY TO USE MY OFFICE, WHERE I HAD OXYGEN, A CRASH CART, AND MONITORING DEVICES LIKE THE OXIMETER, TO USE MY OFFICE TO TREAT MR. JACKSON. AFTER MR. JACKSON GOT THERE, MR. ADAMS, DR. ADAMS WAS WAITING. I BROUGHT HIM UPSTAIRS. I INTRODUCED MYSELF. AND I LEFT THEM.

I SAID, "HOW LONG ARE YOU GOING TO LET HIM SLEEP?" HE TOLD ME HE WAS GOING TO DO FIVE OR SIX HOURS. THIS WAS ABOUT 1:00 O'CLOCK IN THE DAY. SO I SAID, "OKAY. SO I'LL COME BACK AROUND 7:00?" AND HE SAID, "YEAH, 7:00 WILL BE GOOD." AND I CAME BACK AT 7:00 O'CLOCK. WHEN I CAME BACK TO MY OFFICE AT 7:00 O'CLOCK, HE HAD HIS DIPRIVAN DRIP GOING. THERE WAS A PULSE OXIMETER THERE. I HAD SUPPLIED OXYGEN FOR HIS USE DURING THE PROCEDURE. I'M NOT SURE IF IT WAS USED OR NOT. BUT DR. ADAMS DID HAVE AN I.V. BAG THAT WAS DILUTED WITH THE AGENT. AND HE WAS -- MR. JACKSON SLEPT.

WHEN MR. JACKSON WOKE UP, OF COURSE, I BEING HIS INTERMITTENT GENERAL PHYSICIAN, I ASKED HIM HOW HE FELT. AND HE SAID HE NOW FELT WONDERFUL BECAUSE HE WAS ABLE TO GET TO SLEEP. I SAID, "ARE YOU GOING TO LEAVE FOR LOS ANGELES TONIGHT?" HE SAID HE WASN'T

SURE IF HE WAS GOING THAT NIGHT OR THE FOLLOWING DAY.

HE THEN SURPRISED ME THAT SAME EVENING,
BECAUSE BY THEN HE HAD ALREADY MADE THE PROPOSAL TO ME
JOINING HIS TEAM AND GOING TO ENGLAND.

DETECTIVE SMITH: HE'S STILL IN VEGAS NOW.
DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: BUT HE HAD ALREADY PROPOSED TO ME JOINING HIS TEAM AND GOING TO ENGLAND AS HIS EXCLUSIVE MEDICAL DOCTOR. HE THEN SURPRISED ME AND SAID -- HIS WORDS WERE "THIS IS DIVINE GUIDANCE." AND I SAID, "WHAT DO YOU MEAN?" HE SAID, "COME, COME. COME WITH ME. YOU MIND?" SO WE LEFT THE DOCTOR IN ONE ROOM. HE SAID -- I SAID, "EXCUSE ME, DOCTOR."

AND MR. JACKSON PULLED ME DOWN THE HALL,

INTO MY OFFICE ON THIS SUNDAY AFTERNOON -- SUNDAY

EVENING. HE SAID, "CONRAD, YOU KNOW, WHEN I'M ON THIS

COURSE, WHEN I'M ON -- ON THE TOUR, I HAVE DIFFICULTY

SLEEPING. AND WHAT MOST DOCTORS HAVE DONE FOR ME,

THEY HELP ME TO SLEEP FOR 15 TO 18 HOURS, BECAUSE I

NEED IT." SO INNOCENTLY, I WASN'T THINKING THAT HE

WAS SLEEPING 15 TO 18 HOURS WITH ASSISTANCE. I WASN'T

THINKING THAT IT WAS A REGULAR EVERYDAY BASIS.

BUT WHAT HE SAW, AS I LOOK RETROSPECT, IS THAT WHAT DEVELOPED QUICKLY WITHIN THAT EVENING,

HIS -- WHAT HE CALLED THE DIVINE GUIDANCE WAS TO INTRODUCE TO ME, EVEN BEFORE I AGREED TO GO ON HIS TEAM, "HOW ABOUT IF YOU HAVE ANOTHER DOCTOR JOIN YOU?" AND I SAID, "WHY WOULD YOU WANT THAT?" HE SAID, "BECAUSE YOU DON'T QUITE KNOW OR UNDERSTAND THAT THESE HOURS ARE LONG. YOU KNOW, WHEN I SLEEP FOR 15 TO 18 HOURS, THAT'S WHEN I FEEL GOOD ENOUGH TO GET UP TO PERFORM. AND THAT'S WHAT MOST OF THE DOCTORS HAVE DONE FOR ME. AND I THINK ON YOU, IT MAY BE TOO MUCH."

I DIDN'T SEE IT AS BEING TOO MUCH. BUT WHAT MR. JACKSON KNEW IS THAT THIS IS SOMETHING THAT HE DID EVERY DAY. AND BY HIM HAVING THAT EVERY DAY, IT WOULD CERTAINLY BE TOO MUCH FOR ONE DOCTOR. AND I WAS CAUGHT SITTING THERE, IN THE SENSE THAT I SAID, "YOU KNOW, I COULDN'T MAKE A DECISION FOR YOU, MR. JACKSON. YOU WILL HAVE TO KNOW BEST WHAT YOU THINK."

AND SO I SAT THERE WITH DR. ADAMS, AND I -I INTRODUCED MYSELF BETTER, AND I GOT TO KNOW HIM.

AND I SAID, "YOU KNOW, WELL, I'VE TAKEN CARE OF
MICHAEL INTERMITTENTLY, AND HIS CHILDREN. AND IF
THERE'S A NEED FOR A DOCTOR, A SPECIALIST, THEN I
USUALLY SCREEN THEM AND SUPPLY WHAT HE WANTS. BUT YOU
KNOW, HE'S ASKING TO HAVE TWO DOCTORS ON HIS TEAM NOW,
AND I'M NOT SURE WHETHER OR NOT HE COULD AFFORD THAT."
I DID NOT KNOW.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WAS HE MAKING REFERENCE TO DR. ADAMS?

DR. MURRAY: JOINING THE TEAM?

DETECTIVE SMITH: JOINING THE TEAM?

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DID HE SAY DR. ADAMS --

DR. MURRAY: HE WAS --

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- OR DID YOU INFER?

DR. MURRAY: NO, HE'S SITTING RIGHT THERE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO HE WAS GOING TO BE THE SECOND DOCTOR ON THE TEAM.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND I WAS SURPRISED THAT HE WAS BRINGING THAT UP ONLY WITHOUT ANY WARNING. SO I SAID, "WHATEVER YOU WANT." BUT HE WAS FAMILIAR WORKING WITH DR. ADAMS BEFORE AND GETTING THAT SUBSTANCE AS ONE OF HIS TREATING PHYSICIANS FOR DIPRIVAN. AND THAT'S WHAT HAPPENED.

SO I SAID -- I SAID, "WHATEVER HE WANTED."

AND SO DR. ADAMS CONTINUED TO CALL ME, AND HE LEFT

WORD FOR MR. JACKSON, "WHO SHOULD I CONTACT IN CASE I

WANT TO GO TO ENGLAND? SHOULD I GO TO YOU, OR SHOULD

I GO TO MICHAEL?" I SAID, "IT'S UP TO MICHAEL." NOW, MICHAEL SAY, "WELL, TALK TO CONRAD. LET HIM KNOW WHAT YOU WANT, AND THEN WE WILL WORK IT OUT."

WELL, AT THAT TIME, EVEN THOUGH I SORT OF SOMEWHAT AGREED TO GO ON THE TEAM, WE WERE NOT IN CONTRACT. WE HAD NOT LOCKED INTO NUMBERS. I KNOW I HAD MY PRACTICES. I MEAN HOW DO I CLOSE THAT DOWN TO MAKE SENSE TO GO ON A TRIP LIKE THIS WITH THE GENTLEMAN? AND DR. ADAMS DID CALL ME BACK, AND THEN HE SAID THAT HE HAD SPOKEN TO HIS MOTHER. HE HAD CALLED HER. HE HAD SPOKEN TO A FRIEND. AND HE WAS SINGLE AND AVAILABLE AND IS ON BOARD, JUST CALL.

SO I SAID, "WHAT KIND OF INCOME ARE YOU GOING TO LOOK FOR?" HE SAID --

MR. CHERNOFF: IS THIS IMPORTANT TO YOU GUYS?

DETECTIVE SMITH: YOU'RE -- AND WHEN YOU'RE SAYING "WHAT KIND OF INCOME ARE YOU GOING TO LOOK FOR," ARE YOU TALKING TO DR. ADAMS OR MICHAEL?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, DR. ADAMS. IS THAT IMPORTANT TO YOU?

DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH, THAT'S FINE. YEAH, THAT'S FINE.

DR. MURRAY: ARE YOU SURE?

MR. CHERNOFF: HE'S COMPLETELY SKIPPED THE

MOST IMPORTANT PART.

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DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WE'LL GET BACK TO IT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: I KNOW. WE'LL GET BACK TO IT, AND THAT'S FINE. THAT'S FINE.

MR. CHERNOFF: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: I DON'T WANT TO WASTE TIME.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, NO, NO, THAT'S --WE'LL FINISH THIS SUBJECT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: QUITE ALL RIGHT.

DR. MURRAY: MR. ADAMS, DR. ADAMS SAID THAT HE HAD MADE ABOUT \$600,000 IN HIS PREVIOUS YEAR WORKING IN VEGAS WITH A MINIMUM STAFF. THE OVERHEAD WAS SMALL. AND HE TOOK HOME ABOUT HALF A MILLION. AND -- BUT IF HE HAD TO MAKE THE TRIP OR CHANGE AND GIVE UP HIS PRACTICE, HE WANTED TO HAVE A COMMITMENT FOR MAYBE THREE YEARS WITH MR. JACKSON, AND HE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE ABOUT A MILLION TWO OR MILLION THREE. THAT WAS HIS REQUEST. I TOLD THAT TO MICHAEL. AND THERE WAS NO SUBSEQUENT FOLLOW-UP ON THAT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HE DIDN'T END UP JOINING THE TEAM.

DR. MURRAY: NO, BUT HE SAID WAS AVAILABLE. HE KEPT ASKING. HE KEPT TEXTING ME, "HOW ARE THINGS GOING?" AND I JUST SAID, "YOU KNOW, THINGS ARE STILL" --

DETECTIVE SMITH: FOR A MILLION TWO OR A MILLION THREE.

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

MR. CHERNOFF: JUST FOR THE TRIP?

DETECTIVE SMITH: JUST FOR THE TOUR,

EXACTLY.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

MR. CHERNOFF: HOW LONG WAS THE TOUR FOR?

DR. MURRAY: THE TOUR IN ENGLAND WAS GOING TO BE A YEAR, BUT MR. JACKSON HAD SAID THAT FOLLOWING THE TOUR, THERE WERE THREE OR FOUR MOVIES ALREADY PROGRAMMED WITH A.E.G. TO DEVELOP, FOR WHICH HE WANTED ME TO STILL BE AROUND. HE WANTED ME TO BE AROUND FOREVER. THAT'S WHAT HE SAID.

(TELEPHONE INTERRUPTION.)

DETECTIVE SMITH: EXCUSE ME.

DR. MURRAY: HE WANTED ME TO BE AROUND

FOREVER.

MR. CHERNOFF: SCOTT, I KIND OF -- I TOOK YOU FOR (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY THERE. YEAH.

DR. MURRAY: HE WANTED ME TO BE AROUND -
DETECTIVE SMITH: I PUT THE VIBRATING THING,

AND THEN I COULDN'T FEEL IT AFTER A WHILE. SO THEN

I'D HEAR IT.

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DR. MURRAY: YEAH, HE WANTED ME TO BE AROUND FOREVER. AND HE WANTED TO OPEN A CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL, WHERE KIDS FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD CAN COME AND GET TREATMENT. AND HE WANTED ME TO BE THE MEDICAL DIRECTOR, NOT PARTICULARLY TO SEE THEM BUT TO HELP TO HIRE THE SPECIALISTS SO I'LL HAVE THE DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS RUNNING. AND THOSE WERE PEOPLE THAT HE HAD IN MIND FOR DOWN THE ROAD. SO THAT'S -- THAT'S IT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. WE'RE GOING TO GET BACK ON TRACK. WE'RE AT ABOUT 10:50 HOURS.

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHERE YOU GIVE HIM THE PROPOFOL. WE'VE GONE INTO THE HISTORY OF HOW HE ALREADY KNEW ABOUT IT. HE'S THE ONE WHO REQUESTED YOU --

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- FOR IT, GIVING YOU SOME PRESSURE.

MR. CHERNOFF: WE GOT THE MILLIGRAMS, 25.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: 25 MILLIGRAMS, HALF OF WHAT YOU NORMALLY GIVE. NOW, WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

DR. MURRAY: I AM -- I'M MONITORING HIM AT THE HOUSE. AND HE FELL ASLEEP.

DETECTIVE SMITH: 11:00 O'CLOCK NOW? LATER?

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DR. MURRAY: HE FELL ASLEEP FAIRLY QUICKLY,
I WOULD SAY. BUT HE WAS NOT SNORING. NORMALLY, IF
HE'S IN DEEP SLEEP, HE WOULD BE SNORING. I WAS A
LITTLE BIT HESITANT THAT HE WOULD PROBABLY JUMP OUT OF
SLEEP, BECAUSE THAT IS -- HE DOES. HE JUST (SNAPS)
GETS UP LIKE THAT, AND HIS EYES GOES, AND HE'S WIDE
AWAKE. AND WHENEVER HE'S UP, HE REACHES FOR HIS I.V.
SITE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: REAL QUICK ASIDE,

BECAUSE I'M NOT FAMILIAR. IS THIS SOMETHING THAT HAS

TO BE CONTINUALLY INTRODUCED INTO HIM AS A DRIP, OR IS

THIS SOMETHING THAT YOU JUST DO A SMALL INJECTION AND

THEN --

DR. MURRAY: YOU DO A SMALL INJECTION TO HELP HIM TO SLEEP, AND THEN YOU TRY TO DRIP SLOWLY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: SO THAT HE CONTINUES TO SLEEP.
DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

MR. CHERNOFF: IT'S LIKE ANESTHETIC. IT'S
LIKE A GENERAL ANESTHETIC. IN FACT, IT'S USED FOR
THAT, PRIMARILY BEFORE IT -- BEFORE THE GAS GOES DOWN,
A LOT OF TIMES THEY'LL HAVE THAT DRIP. THAT'S WHAT
HE'S BEEN SLEEPING ON FOR YEARS.

DR. MURRAY: BUT THERE'S ALSO -- USED
IN PATIENTS WHO, YOU KNOW, ARE VERY ILL AND THEY NEED

TO KEEP THEM COMPLETELY SEDATED. YOU KNOW, IT'S BEING USED.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SORRY. DIDN'T MEAN TO INTERRUPT. SO HE FELL ASLEEP QUICKLY, BUT HE WASN'T SNORING. SO HE'S NOT IN A DEEP SLEEP.

DR. MURRAY: I WAS WORRIED ABOUT THAT,

BECAUSE WHEN HE IS NOT DEEP, THEN HE COULD JUST

QUICKLY WAKE UP. BUT I WAS -- I'M MONITORING HIM. I

STAYED THERE AND WATCHED. I MONITORED, SAW HIS OXYGEN

SATURATION. IT WAS IN THE HIGH 90'S, 90 PERCENT.

HEART RATE WAS ROUGHLY IN THE 70'S. EVERYTHING LOOKED

STABLE.

I MONITORED HIM. I SAT THERE AND WATCH HIM
FOR LONG ENOUGH PERIOD THAT I FELT COMFORTABLE. THEN
I NEEDED TO GO TO THE BATHROOM. SO I GOT UP, WENT TO
THE BATHROOM TO RELEASE MYSELF OF URINE AND ALSO
CONSIDER GETTING RID OF SOME OF HIS URINATION THAT HE
HAD PUT IN THE JUGS OVERNIGHT.

THEN I CAME BACK TO HIS BEDSIDE AND WAS

STUNNED IN THE SENSE THAT HE WASN'T BREATHING, BECAUSE
I ALWAYS WANT TO LOOK AT HIS CHEST AND LOOK AT HIS
DIAPHRAGMATIC MOTION AND ALL OF THOSE THINGS. I
CHECKED -- I LOOKED AT THE PULSE OXIMETER RIGHT AWAY,
AND HIS HEART RATE WAS LIKE 122 BEATS.

MR. CHERNOFF: THAT'S WHAT --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LET'S -- TO GO BACK, I
KNOW IT'S A HUGE HOUSE. I DON'T KNOW WHERE THE
BATHROOM WAS. ABOUT HOW LONG WOULD THAT TAKE TO GO TO
THE RESTROOM?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, BASED UPON THE ROOM THAT HE HAS, I GO THROUGH -- I LEAVE HIS BEDSIDE. I WALK THROUGH ANOTHER CHAMBER, WHICH IS LIKE A DRESSING AREA. AND THEN I GET INTO THE THIRD VAULT, WHICH IS WHERE THE BATHROOMS ARE AND THE -- AND WHERE I CAN URINATE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO COUPLE MINUTES THAT YOU WERE GONE?

DR. MURRAY: I WAS GONE, I WOULD SAY, ABOUT TWO MINUTES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ABOUT TWO MINUTES. OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT. SO YOU HAD THE IMPRESSION HE WASN'T BREATHING, AND YOU SAID HIS PULSE WAS HIGH?

DR. MURRAY: WHEN I CAME BACK, YEAH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: GO ON.

DR. MURRAY: BEDSIDE AND MY CLINICAL
OBSERVATION. SO IMMEDIATELY I FELT FOR A PULSE, AND I
WAS ABLE TO GET A THREADY PULSE IN THE FEMORAL REGION.

HIS BODY WAS WARM. THERE WAS NO CHANGE IN COLOR. SO I -- I ASSUMED THAT EVERYTHING HAPPENED VERY QUICKLY, JUST ABOUT THE TIME I WAS GONE, WITHIN THAT TIME AND COMING BACK. SO I STARTED IMMEDIATELY TO PERFORM C.P.R. AND MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION.

DETECTIVE SMITH: MANUALLY YOU'RE DOING THE C.P.R., OR DO YOU HAVE A RESUSCITATOR?

MR. CHERNOFF: FIRST THING HE DID?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, I OBSERVED HIM CLINICALLY.

MR. CHERNOFF: DID YOU APPLY ANY MEDICINE OR DO ANYTHING?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, THE FIRST THING I WANTED TO DO -- I DID APPLY MEDICINE BUT NOT FIRST. I WANTED TO RESUSCITATE HIM.

MR. CHERNOFF: ALL RIGHT. SORRY.

DR. MURRAY: AND THE KEY THING IS THAT IF HE WAS NOT BREATHING, I WANTED TO MAKE SURE I VENTILATE HIM AND TO COMPRESS HIM. I ALSO KNOW WITH C.P.R., THAT THE BEST THING YOU CAN DO FOR A PATIENT IS TO -- IF YOU DON'T EVEN VENTILATE, MAKE SURE YOU DO COMPRESSIONS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DO COMPRESSIONS.

DR. MURRAY: SO I STARTED WITH HIS CHEST COMPRESSIONS, AND THEN I -- I SWIFTLY WENT A

SINGLE-MAN RESUSCITATION TO VENTILATE HIM DIRECTLY,
MOUTH TO MOUTH. I SAW HIS CHEST RISE APPROPRIATELY
AND FALL. SO I KNEW THAT I WAS VENTILATING HIM AND
I'M GETTING OXYGEN INTO HIM. AND THEN I WOULD SWITCH
BACK TO C.P.R.

I -- WHILE I'M DOING THAT, I LOOK AT THE
TELEPHONE. OF NOTE, NO TELEPHONES IN THAT HOUSE
WORKS. WHY IS THAT DESIGNED SO? I GUESS TO AVOID
CALLS, BECAUSE MR. JACKSON CONSTANTLY CHANGED HIS CELL
PHONE NUMBER.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: REAL QUICK, IS HE -ARE YOU DOING C.P.R. WHILE HE'S ON THE BED, OR DID YOU
MOVE HIM OFF THE BED?

DR. MURRAY: I CAN'T MOVE HIM OFF THE BED ON MY OWN AND THEN DO --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: QUICKEST THING I CAN DO IS TO
TRY TO GET HIM VENTILATED AND DO C.P.R. BUT WHAT I
DID WAS TO IMPROVISE. HIS BED IS FAIRLY FIRM BUT
STILL MAY NOT BE FIRM ENOUGH FOR IT TO BE VERY
EFFECTIVE. SO I GOT MY LEFT HAND UNDER HIS BODY, AND
I COMPRESSED WITH MY HAND NOT MOVING, IN PLACE.

AND ONCE I THOUGHT I HAD GIVEN HIM

APPROPRIATE C.P.R. -- THE HOUSE IS CLOSED. AT NIGHT,

IT'S JUST HIS CHILDREN, HE, AND MYSELF ARE INSIDE.

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SECURITY DON'T COME INTO HIS HOUSE TO EVEN USE THE BATHROOM. I'M TOLD THAT THEY USE A GAS STATION AROUND THE CORNER. I FELT THAT IT WAS A LITTLE BIT INHUMANE, AND THAT WEEK I SPOKE TO THEM TO AT LEAST LET SECURITY HAVE SOME ACCESS TO A GUEST BATHROOM, BECAUSE WHEN ONE GUY LEAVES -- THERE WERE JUST TWO AT NIGHT. IT MAY --YOU NEVER KNOW WHAT CAN HAPPEN, AND YOU MAY NEED ASSISTANCE. I DON'T THINK THAT THAT TOOK EFFECT.

BUT ANYWAY, I GOT MY HAND UNDER HIS BACK. AND IN ADDITION TO DOING C.P.R., I VENTILATED HIM MAN -- ORALLY. AND IT WAS -- I MADE SURE THAT HIS CHEST WAS RISING COMPLETELY WITH DEEP BREATHS AND FALLING. THEN KNOWING THAT THE PHONES DON'T WORK, I FOUND THAT OUT A FEW WEEKS BEFORE, WHEN I LIFTED FOR DIAL TONE AND TRIED TO MAKE A CALL, AND THERE WAS NO WAY THIS PHONE IS WORKING. AND I ASKED ABOUT THAT. AND THEY SAID, "WELL, YOU KNOW, THE PHONES AROUND HERE DON'T WORK."

SO HAVING THAT KNOWLEDGE, THE ONLY WAY I CAN GET HELP IS -- WELL, I KNOW THAT HE LIVES AT 100 NORTH CAROLWOOD. I DON'T KNOW THE ZIP CODE. TO SPEAK TO A 911 OPERATOR WOULD BE TO NEGLECT HIM. I DON'T HAVE THAT AVAILABILITY. I WANT TO VENTILATE HIM, DO CHEST COMPRESSION, ENOUGH TO GIVE ME AN OPPORTUNITY.

WHILE I GOT THAT DONE, I THEN CONTINUED

C.P.R. WITH MY LEFT HAND SINGULARLY, REACHED FOR MY
CELL PHONE AND THEN CALLED HIS ASSISTANT, WHICH NUMBER
I HAD, BROTHER MICHAEL. I TOLD HIM, "BROTHER MICHAEL,
YOU NEED TO SEND SECURITY UP TO MR. JACKSON'S ROOM
IMMEDIATELY. WE HAVE A PROBLEM." OKAY?

DETECTIVE SMITH: THAT'S MICHAEL AMIR; CORRECT?

DR. MURRAY: YES, UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: I DID NOT WANT HIM TO -- I
COULDN'T ASK HIM AT THAT TIME TO CALL 911 BECAUSE HE
WOULD WANT TO KNOW WHAT IT WAS ABOUT AND I HAVE A
PATIENT THAT NEEDS HELP AND I'M TRYING TO ASSIST, AND
I'M TRYING TO DO IT THE BEST I CAN AND TO TRY TO GET
HELP.

I THEN RETURNED TO -- AFTER THAT PHONE CALL,
I RETURNED TO HIS BODY WITH THE SAME CONSISTENCY OF
C.P.R. AND ORAL AIRWAY MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION.
RECOGNIZING THAT HIS PULSE WAS -- I DIDN'T HAVE A
PULSE NOW. I THEN LIFTED HIS LEG, WHICH CAN GIVE YOU
WHAT IS AN AUTOTRANSFUSION. IN OTHER WORDS, THE BLOOD
IN YOUR LEGS, IF YOU LIFT THE LEGS, THEY CAN POOL BACK
TOWARDS HIS HEART. SO I DID THAT, ELEVATE HIS LEGS,
JUST FOR A BRIEF MOMENT. I WOULD LOVE TO HAVE HAD IT
STAY UP, BUT I HAD NOTHING TO PROP IT UP. SO I

AUTOTRANSFUSED HIM AS BEST AS I CAN, CONTINUE C.P.R., CONTINUE MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION.

NO ONE CAME TO THE DOOR. NO ONE KNOCKED THE DOOR. ABOUT A MINUTE WAS GONE. I DID C.P.R. THEN I REACHED INTO THE BAG. I QUICKLY TOOK A SYRINGE AND GOT FLUMAZENIL, F-L-U-M-A -- FLUMAZENIL, F-L-U-M-A-Z-E-N-I-L, FLUMAZENIL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. FLUMAZENIL IS AN
ANTIDOTE THAT CAN REFUSE THE EFFECTS OF A
BENZODIAZEPINE. AND THE FACT THAT HE HAD GOTTEN
LORAZEPAM, THE FACT THAT HE HAD GOTTEN VERSED, I
WANTED TO REVERSE THE EFFECTS OF THOSE AGENTS, SHOULD
THEY BE WORKING TOGETHER NOW IN ADDITION TO THE MILK
THAT HE WAS GIVEN, ALL IN THE EFFORT OF ASSISTING HIM.
I GAVE 0.2 MILLIGRAM OF FLUMAZENIL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: 0.2?

DR. MURRAY: 0.2 MILLIGRAMS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND THIS WAS INTO THE I.V. AGAIN OR --

DR. MURRAY: STRAIGHT --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- INTO HIM?

DR. MURRAY: INTO THE I.V.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: INTO THE I.V. TO -- I

CONTINUED TO DO CHEST COMPRESSION TO CIRCULATE THE MEDICATION. HOPEFULLY, IT WILL HAVE -- IF HIS RESPIRATORY STATUS WAS DEPRESSED, IT WILL REVERSE THE EFFECT OF THE MEDICATION, AND HE WILL TRY TO BREATHE. BUT HE STILL DID NOT BREATHE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND NO HELP IS COMING.

DR. MURRAY: NO HELP IS COMING. SO I NOW
DID CHEST COMPRESSION, DID MOUTH-TO-MOUTH
RESUSCITATION AGAIN, ENOUGH TO MAKE SURE THAT HE WAS
WELL VENTILATED. CHEST COMPRESSION WAS THERE. OPENED
THE DOOR, RAN OUT AND WENT LEFT ON THE SECOND LEVEL,
DOWN TOWARDS THE KITCHEN, WHERE SECURITY WOULD BE.
AND WHEN I GOT TO THE BOTTOM OF THE STAIRS, I SAW THE
CHEF, WHO WAS COOKING. I THINK HER NAME IS ROSE. AND
I TOLD HER, "I HAVE AN EMERGENCY. HAVE SECURITY COME
IMMEDIATELY."

THAT'S WHEN THE GENTLEMAN YOU HEAR ON THE
911 CALL COMES UPSTAIRS. THE DOOR IS OPEN. HE GETS
INSIDE THERE. I SAID, "CALL 911." WHILE HE'S DOING
911, I AM DOING CHEST COMPRESSIONS. I'M DOING
MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION. BUT I WANT 911 TO BE
CALLED NOW, EVEN THOUGH HE'S STILL ON THE BED, BECAUSE
I WOULD STILL NEED HELP TO MOVE HIM OFF FROM THE BED
AND PLACE HIM AT AN APPROPRIATE SITE ON THE FLOOR,
WHERE I WOULD HAVE A FIRMER SURFACE.

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SO I CONTINUE TO SUPPORT HIS BACK WHEN I DO THE CHEST COMPRESSIONS. I CONTINUE TO VENTILATE HIM WITH MY MOUTH. THE OPERATOR IS ASKING THE SECURITY GUARD WHAT'S GOING ON. I SAID, "WE HAVE A PATIENT THAT IS NOT BREATHING." ALL OF THE THINGS HE'S SAYING, HE'S GETTING FROM ME. "HOW OLD IS HE?" I SAID, "50 YEARS," BECAUSE HE DOESN'T KNOW HIS AGE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BUT DO YOU KNOW WHO THE SECURITY GUARD WAS?

DR. MURRAY: ALBERTO ALVAREZ. ALBERTO ALVAREZ.

AND THE OPERATORS CONTINUED TO ASK QUESTIONS, AND I SAID, "JUST TELL THEM TO GET HERE," BECAUSE I WANTED HIM TO COME DOWN AND HELP ME MOVE HIM TO A HARDER SURFACE SO WE CAN DO C.P.R. AND VENTILATE HIM. AND SO THE OPERATOR SAID THAT THEY WERE ON THE WAY. SO HE PUT THE PHONE DOWN. HE CAME THEN TO THE BEDSIDE. WE MOVED THE PATIENT TO THE FLOOR, WHICH WAS WHAT I WANTED TO DO. AND THEN I CONTINUED TO DO C.P.R. AND MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION UNTIL PARAMEDICS CAME.

WHEN PARAMEDICS CAME, THEY CALLED U.C.L.A. THEY HOOKED HIM UP TO THE PULSE OXIMETER. HE WAS NOT BREATHING. WE WERE DOING CHEST COMPRESSION. WE WERE BAGGING HIM. WE GOT HIM INTUBATED. WE ALSO REALIZED

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THAT HIS RHYTHM WAS WHAT WE CALL P.E.A. P.E.A.

DETECTIVE SMITH: P.E.A.?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT IS THAT?

DR. MURRAY: PULSELESS ELECTRICAL ACTIVITY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: PULSELESS?

DR. MURRAY: PULSELESS ELECTRICAL ACTIVITY.

THIS IS WHERE YOU HAVE --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: GO AHEAD.

DR. MURRAY: -- A HEARTBEAT THAT IS

ELECTRICALLY SEEN, BUT EVERY TIME THE BEAT -- YOU SEE

THE BEAT, THE HEART DOES NOT CONTRACT TO PUSH A PULSE.

THE TREATMENT OF THAT IS NEVER TO SHOCK THE PATIENT.

SO THERE WAS NO REASON TO SHOCK HIM. THEY USE SHOCK

FOR CONDITIONS LIKE VENTRICULAR FIBRILLATION,

VENTRICULAR TACHYCARDIA, AND SUCH STATE. BUT WITH

P.E.A., YOU NEVER SHOCK. YOU TREAT THE UNDERLYING

CONDITION.

SO HE GOT MEDICINES AS CALLED IN BY

U.C.L.A., ATROPINE, EPINEPHRINE. I THEN ENCOURAGED

THEM TO CONSIDER BICARBONATE, WHICH IS -- BECAUSE I

WOULD BELIEVE THAT AT THIS TIME HE WOULD HAVE SOME

ACIDEMIA, ACID MEANING THAT, YOU KNOW, NOT GETTING

MUCH OXYGEN, YOU CAN -- YOUR BLOOD PH WILL GO DOWN.

SO I ASKED FOR BICARBONATE TO HELP HIM METABOLICALLY

WHILE WE CONTINUED TO DO C.P.R., TO START AN I.V.,
WHICH WAS DONE. THE PARAMEDICS FOUGHT FOR A WHILE TO
GET AN I.V. WHY?

DETECTIVE SMITH: TRYING TO FIND A VEIN?

DR. MURRAY: VEIN IS DIFFICULT WITH

MR. JACKSON. AND IN THE PROCESS OF MOVING HIM, MY

I.V. SITE BECAME DISLODGED.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NOW, REAL QUICK, WHEN YOU TALKED ABOUT THERE'S NO NEED TO SHOCK HIM, DID THEY DO IT AGAINST YOUR WISHES? DID THE PARAMEDICS SHOCK HIM?

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO HE WAS NEVER SHOCKED.

DR. MURRAY: NO, NEVER.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DEFIBRILLATOR WAS NEVER

USED?

DR. MURRAY: NEVER. THERE WAS NO INDICATION

FOR THAT. I'M A CARDIOLOGIST. I KNOW THAT. SO -
DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND DID THE -- DID THEY

GIVE HIM THAT BICARBONATE STUFF?

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND THEY -- THE U.C.L.A. AGREED

TO GIVE HIM SOME BICARBONATE. THEY AGREED FOR THE EPINEPHRINE, THE ATROPINE. BUT I THOUGHT AS A DOCTOR, U.C.L.A. GIVING ORDERS, THEY WERE KIND OF SLOW. YOU KNOW, IT WAS SLOW STATUS. AND THEN THEY FIND THAT -- TOLD THEM THEY DON'T HAVE AN I.V. ACCESS EASILY, IT MADE THINGS WORSE, AND THEY HAD TO SEARCH FOR I.V. SITES EVERYWHERE SO THAT, NEEDLES AND EVERYTHING ELSE.

20 MINUTES OF AN EFFORT, WHICH I THINK WAS LIMITED,
BECAUSE HIS CONDITION WAS ALMOST, I WOULD SAY,
WITNESSED, IN THE SENSE THAT I HAD NOT GONE FOR A LONG
TIME BEFORE I GOT BACK TO THE BED. IT WAS JUST SO
SHORT. HERE, I WOULD CALL IT A WITNESS STATE. AND I
STARTED C.P.R. AND EVERYTHING RIGHT AWAY. IT WAS
EFFECTIVE. IT WAS DEEP. I KNOW THAT I CAN FEEL
FEMORAL PULSES WITH MY COMPRESSIONS. SO I KNEW THAT
HIS CIRCULATION WAS INTACT -- WAS BEING -- WAS KEPT
GOING WITH MY EFFORT.

I THEN ASKED U.C.L.A. TO TRANSFER THE CARE
TO ME. AND THEY SAY -- SO INSTEAD OF CALLING HIM
DEAD, BECAUSE THEY'RE FEELING NOTHING WAS WORKING AT
THE TIME AND THEY DIDN'T THINK THAT THEY WOULD BE ABLE
TO GET HIM BACK, THEY SAID, "IF THE DOCTOR WANTS TO
TRY, IF HE -- ACCEPT THE CARE, THAT WILL BE FINE,"
BECAUSE THE DOCTOR DIDN'T WANT TO SPEND TOO

MUCH LONGER ON THE LINE TRYING TO GIVE MEDICATION. I
FIGURE THAT I WANTED TO GIVE HIM THE BEST EFFORT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO ALL OF THIS IS GOING ON. YOU'RE CARING FOR HIM, WITH THE PARAMEDICS' HELP, ON THE FLOOR AT THE HOUSE, NOTHING IN THE AMBULANCE YET.

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. AND THEY WANT TO GIVE UP.

DR. MURRAY: I SAID NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO THEY TRANSFER CARE TO YOU.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: I MEAN I LOVE MR. JACKSON. HE
WAS MY FRIEND. AND HE OPENED UP TO ME IN DIFFERENT
WAYS. AND I WANTED TO HELP HIM AS MUCH AS I CAN. YOU
KNOW, HE WAS A SINGLE PARENT. YOU DON'T ALWAYS HEAR
THAT FROM A MAN. BUT HE WOULD STATE THAT, YOU KNOW,
HE WAS A SINGLE PARENT OF THREE. AND I -- I ALWAYS
THOUGHT OF HIS CHILDREN, YOU KNOW, AS I WOULD THINK
ABOUT MINE. SO I WANTED TO GIVE HIM THE BEST CHANCE.
SO I YOU KNOW --

DETECTIVE SMITH: DID THEY RELINQUISH THE RESPONSIBILITY?

DR. MURRAY: THEY RELINQUISHED THE RESPONSIBILITY TO ME.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: I CONTINUED C.P.R.,

EPINEPHRINE, ATROPINE, BICARBONATE. I.V. ACCESSED.

FLUID WAS GOING. I MEAN DEEP CHEST COMPRESSIONS ALL

THE WAY INTO THE AMBULANCE. AND I TOLD THEM THAT I'M

TRANSPORTING HIM TO THE U.C.L.A.

I WAS IN THE AMBULANCE WITH MR. JACKSON. WE GOT TO U.C.L.A. WE TOOK HIM INTO THE -- INTO THE OPERATING SUITE, WHERE THERE WAS A HOST OF MEDICAL PERSONNEL WORKING TO ASSIST HIM. AND WE TRIED. WE TRIED FOR AT LEAST AN HOUR. AND I THINK THEY MAY HAVE GIVEN UP EARLIER HADN'T I BEEN INSISTING AND GIVING HIM EVERY OPPORTUNITY.

AND THEY FINALLY DECIDED THAT THEY WILL TRY
A BALLOON PUMP ON HIM, WHICH WAS A DEVICE PLACED ON
THE AORTA THROUGH THE ARTERY AND IT WILL PUMP THE
HEART DURING DIASTOLE OR WHEN THE HEART -- IN BETWEEN
BEATS AND PUSH OXYGENATED BLOOD BACK TO HIS LUNGS -TO HIS HEART. I ASKED THE CARDIOLOGIST. I SAID, "DO
YOU THINK THAT THAT WILL BE EFFECTIVE?" HE SAID HE
HAD DONE IT BEFORE AND HE HAD GOOD RESULTS. I SAID,
"THEN FINE." IT'S NOT SOMETHING THAT I WOULD DO,
BECAUSE I DON'T THINK BALLOON PUMPS HELP YOU IF

THERE'S NO BLOOD PRESSURE. BUT HE WANTED TO TRY, AND I WAS WILLING TO GIVE HIM ANY EFFORT THAT WAS NECESSARY. SO I SAID, "PROCEED."

SO HE -- AFTER EVERYTHING WAS DONE TO

MR. JACKSON, WE JUST CANNOT GET A BLOOD GAS. THE

FIRST BLOOD GAS CAME BACK, AND THE PH -- THE PO2,

WHICH IS THE OXYGEN PRESSURE, WAS IN THE 20'S. AND

THEY THOUGHT IT WAS VENOUS. AND THEN THEY LET -- I

ASKED THEM TO REPEAT IT AFTER THEY GOT THE ARTERIAL

LINE IN AND WE CAN SEE THAT THE BLOOD WAS RED. BUT

THE OTHER BLOOD GASES CAME BACK WITH A PO2 OF ABOUT IN

THE 30'S. SO THEN --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHICH IS BETTER, 20'S OR 30'S?

DR. MURRAY: IT SHOULD BE IN THE 70'S TO

90'S. SO IT'S A LITTLE OVER. 30 IS BETTER THAN 25.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND I WAS WONDERING AT THAT

TIME WHY WOULD THE CO2, WHICH IS COMMONLY

(UNINTELLIGIBLE), IT'S IN THE 50'S. NORMALLY, IT'S

ABOUT 40. HIS PH IS DOWN TO LIKE 7.2. WE EXPECT HIM

TO BE ACIDOTIC. WHY COULDN'T WE GET HIS OXYGEN UP?

SO AT THAT TIME WHEN WE CALL THE CODE AND THE DOCTOR

SAID SHE CAN'T EXPLAIN, AND I SAID, "I DON'T HAVE AN

EXPLANATION EITHER, BUT WE CANNOT RULE OUT THE

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POSSIBILITY OF PULMONARY EMBOLISM."

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND WHAT IS A PULMONARY EMBOLISM?

DR. MURRAY: A PULMONARY EMBOLISM IS A BLOOD CLOT THAT GOES TO THE LUNGS AND PREVENTS ANY KIND OF OXYGENATED BLOOD TO GO TO THE LUNG, WHERE OXIDATION TAKES PLACE SO BLOOD CAN BE EXCHANGED WITH THE TISSUE. A MASSIVE PULMONARY EMBOLISM WOULD SHUT DOWN ALL CIRCULATION TO THE LUNGS AND WILL GIVE YOU THAT PICTURE AND CAN ALSO GIVE YOU PULSELESS ELECTRICAL ACTIVITY. THAT'S WHY WE DID NOT HAVE TO SHOCK HIS HEART. SO --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: REAL QUICK. SORRY TO INTERRUPT. REAL QUICK. WHEN YOU ARRIVED AT U.C.L.A., DOES THE -- I'M NOT SURE. I'M NOT FAMILIAR WITH THE RULES. DOES THE CARE THEN TRANSFER BACK TO U.C.L.A. HOSPITAL, OR IT STAYS WITH YOU?

DR. MURRAY: THE TRANSFER WAS DIRECT TO U.C.L.A.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: BECAUSE I DON'T HAVE PRIVILEGES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: BUT I STAYED IN THE AREA, AND THEY ALLOWED ME TO DO THAT, YOU KNOW, IN THE

PERIPHERY. AND I MADE SUGGESTIONS, AND THEY WERE AMENABLE TO THAT. AND THEN SUBSEQUENTLY THE CARDIOLOGIST CAME. WE TRIED THE BALLOON PUMP.

MR. CHERNOFF: CAN I -- DO YOU GUYS MIND IF
I ADD A LITTLE BIT?

DETECTIVE SMITH: NO, NOT AT ALL.

MR. CHERNOFF: ONE OF THE THINGS THAT -- THE DIFFERENCE HERE IS DESPITE THE FACT THAT MR. JACKSON WAS USING THIS DRUG TO SLEEP, I GUESS, A LONG TIME, THERE WAS A CHANGE IN HIS DRUG INTAKE THE THREE DAYS PRIOR TO HIS DEATH. COULD YOU EXPLAIN WHY THAT WAS? I DON'T THINK WE GOT TO IT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: NO, NOT YET.

DR. MURRAY: OKAY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND BEFORE WE GET THERE,
OBVIOUSLY, INEVITABLY, THINGS HAPPEN AND --

DR. MURRAY: HE PASSES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- HE PASSES.

DR. MURRAY: THEY PRONOUNCED HIM. AND AT THAT TIME I RECOMMENDED. I AM THE ONE THAT RECOMMENDED. THEY SAID, "WELL, IS THERE A DOCTOR WHO'S GOING TO SIGN THE DEATH CERTIFICATE?" AND I SAID, "I WOULDN'T WANT TO SIGN THE DEATH CERTIFICATE ON MR. JACKSON WHEN I DON'T UNDERSTAND THE CAUSE OF HIS DEATH." AND THEREFORE I RECOMMENDED THAT HE HAVE

AN AUTOPSY. THAT'S WHERE THE RECOMMENDATION CAME FROM.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, WE'VE BEEN TOLD BY DIFFERENT SOURCES THAT THAT IS WHAT HAPPENED.

DR. MURRAY: I RECOMMENDED IT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YES.

DR. MURRAY: OKAY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT.

MR. CHERNOFF: JUST TELL HIM WHAT HAPPENED THE THREE DAYS PRIOR, PLEASE.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. MR. JACKSON WAS MY

FRIEND. I LOVED HIM. I MEAN WE HAD A GREAT

RELATIONSHIP. AND AFTER JOINING HIS TEAM, I FELL INTO

THE SITUATION WITH A GENTLEMAN WHO WANTED A REGULAR,

FREQUENTLY, NIGHTLY DIPRIVAN. THAT WAS NOT MY PURPOSE

OF JOINING HIS TEAM. I WAS THERE TO HELP HIM, AND I

WAS GOING TO BE AVAILABLE SHOULD SOMETHING GO WRONG,

TO HELP PROVIDE THE BEST CARE FOR HIM. THAT WAS

FRUSTRATING TO ME.

AND AFTER I SAW THAT THIS COULD BE A

HABIT -- WHICH I DID NOT RECOGNIZE BEFORE. BUT NOW

BEING WITH HIM ALL THE TIME, IT WAS NOT NATURAL. I

THEN TRIED TO HELP MR. JACKSON. I WAS TRYING TO WEAN

HIM OFF THE PROPOFOL.

BUT LIKE EVERYTHING ELSE, YOU HAVE TO LOOK

AT BEHAVIOR PATTERN. I HAD NOT SEEN ANY STUDY WHERE SOMEONE WAS ADDICTED TO THAT MEDICATION, BECAUSE THAT'S ALWAYS USED IN SOME SITUATION WHERE ONE DOES NOT GET IT SO FREQUENTLY. BUT IF YOU GOT ACCUSTOMED TO ANY AGENT THAT IS STUDIED IN THAT WAY, YOU DEFINITELY MAY SEE THAT THERE COULD BE DEPENDENCY.

SO WITH CAUTIOUSNESS AGAIN, I WAS CONCERNED HOW IT WAS DIFFICULT TO GET HIM TO SLEEP THAT NIGHT AND COULD NOT TELL IF THAT WAS A WITHDRAWAL EFFECT FROM WHAT HE WAS ACCUSTOMED TO. WHY DID I COME TO THAT CONCLUSION? THREE DAYS BEFORE HIS DEATH, I STARTED TO WEAN MR. JACKSON FROM PROPOFOL.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DID YOU DO THIS WITH HIS KNOWLEDGE OR WITHOUT HIS KNOWLEDGE?

INFORMATION. I TOLD HIM THAT I WANTED HIM TO ASSUME A MORE NATURAL PATTERN OF SLEEP. I WANTED HIM TO BE MORE PHYSIOLOGICAL, LIKE EMULOUS. IF YOU EXERCISE, YOU PERFORM AND YOU'RE TIRED, I WANTED HIM TO GO TO SLEEP NATURALLY. AND THEN I ASKED HIM, "IF THIS IS YOUR PATTERN, WHAT'S GOING TO HAPPEN WHEN THE SHOW IS OVER? ARE YOU GOING TO CONTINUE LIKE THIS?" HE SAID, "NO, I THINK I'LL DO FINE. I THINK I'LL BE ABLE TO SLEEP WITHOUT IT." BUT THAT'S WHAT HE'S SAYING TO ME AT THAT TIME.

I SAID, "WELL, I THINK WE NEED TO TRY LESSER
AGENTS THAT IS NOT AS -- AS PROPOFOL -- TO HELP YOU
AND TRY TO SEE IF WE CAN WEAN IT AWAY." SO I STARTED
THREE DAYS BEFORE. IT WAS 72 HOURS BEFORE. I SAW HIM
EVERY NIGHT. THAT'S WHEN I STARTED TO USE MORE THE
LORAZEPAM AND VERSED.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BEFORE THAT NIGHT, HAD HE USED THEM BEFORE, OR IS THAT --

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- THE FIRST TIME THAT YOU INTRODUCED IT TO HIM?

DR. MURRAY: NO

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY

DR. MURRAY: I INTRODUCED IT TO HIM ABOUT THREE NIGHTS OR SO BEFORE. NOW, WHAT WAS THE --

MR. CHERNOFF: WELL, I THINK THE DETECTIVE

IS ASKING BEFORE THOSE THREE NIGHTS, HAD HE EVER USED

THE VERSED AND --

DR. MURRAY: YES. BUT NOT WHERE THAT WOULD BE THE SOLE AGENTS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: TRYING TO --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HE'D USE THEM IN COMBINATION --

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- AND LESSER AMOUNTS.

DR. MURRAY: LESSER AMOUNTS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND YOU'RE TRYING TO BRING DOWN THE PROPOFOL AND --

DR. MURRAY: AND GET HIM OFF.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT. AND SO YOU GAVE HIM --

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- LORAZEPAM AND -DR. MURRAY: AND -- LORAZEPAM AND THE
MIDAZOLAM, WHICH IS THE VERSED AND THE ATIVAN. OKAY?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND HE KNOWS -- HE
AGREED FOR YOU TO DO THIS.

DR. MURRAY: RELUCTANTLY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: RELUCTANTLY. HE FOUGHT ME ON IT, AND HE SAID, "YOU KNOW, I MEAN WOULD IT WORK THE SAME WAY, BECAUSE I" -- BUT THAT WAS SHOWING ME SOME DEPENDENCY HERE. "WOULD I BE ABLE TO SLEEP?"

I SAID, "WELL, YOU KNOW, CLEARLY IT IS NOT
AS STRONG AN AGENT. BUT IF WE CAN HELP YOU TO SLEEP
MORE NATURALLY AND THEN EVENTUALLY YOU CAN BE ON YOUR
OWN, MILK AND COOKIES AND ALL THE DIFFERENT THINGS
THAT IS NICE AND COMFORTING BEFORE YOU GO TO BED, THAT
WOULD BE BETTER FOR YOU, MICHAEL." AND HE SAID,
"WELL, I REALLY WANT TO -- BUT I REALLY WANT TO SLEEP.

ARE YOU SURE IT'S GOING TO MAKE ME SLEEP?" I SAID, "I CANNOT TELL YOU WITH CERTAINTY THAT IT WILL MAKE YOU SLEEP, BUT I'D LIKE YOU TO TRY."

I NEVER IDENTIFIED TO HIM THAT I BELIEVED AT THAT TIME HE MAY -- HE WAS SHOWING DEPENDENCY OR THAT HE MAY HAVE BEEN DRUG SEEKING, BECAUSE I WAS TRYING TO FORM A DIFFERENT POLICY WITH HIM SO HE CAN TRANSFER CONFIDENCE FROM THAT AGENT TO SOMETHING LESSER. SO I GAVE HIM THE VERSED THE THIRD NIGHT. I GAVE HIM VERSED, AND I GAVE HIM ATIVAN, AND I GAVE HIM A LOWER DOSE OF THE INJECTION OF THE -- OF THE PROPOFOL MILK AT A SLOWER DRIP RATE.

AND EXCEPT FOR SOME INTERRUPTIONS IN SLEEP,
I WAS ABLE TO GET HIM TO SLEEP FOR A REASONABLE TIME.
BUT HE WANTED TO GO ALL THE WAY AGAIN TILL ABOUT NOON,
YOU KNOW, VERY LONG HOURS OF SLEEP, WHICH AGAIN WAS
NOT IDEAL, BUT THAT'S WHAT HE WANTED, BECAUSE THE
OTHER DOCTORS WORKING WITH HIM GAVE HIM 15 TO
18 HOURS. SO THAT WAS NIGHT 1. REDUCE -- REDUCE
PROPOFOL, STARTING MORE LORAZEPAM AND VERSED.

ON THE SECOND NIGHT, WHICH WAS THE NIGHT
BEFORE HE DIED, NO MILK WAS GIVEN. I THOUGHT WE WERE
REALLY ONTO SOMETHING THEN. HE GOT THE LORAZEPAM AND
THE VERSED ONLY. HE SEEMED TO HAVE RESPONDED MORE
PHYSIOLOGICAL TO THAT. HE WAS NOT GROGGY WHEN HE WOKE

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UP. IF HE GOT UP IN THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT, HE'D WAKE UP VERY QUICKLY. BUT HE GOT SOME SLEEP.

MORE OF A HANGOVER DURING THE DAY, BUT I THINK THAT
THAT WAS SUBJECTIVE. I THINK THAT WAS HIS TELLING ME
"I TRIED IT YOUR WAY, BUT I REALLY DON'T LIKE IT. I
WANT DIPRIVAN." SO I SAID, "BUT YOU SLEPT PRETTY WELL
LAST NIGHT, MICHAEL. AND THIS IS DAY NUMBER 2. SO
LET'S CONTINUE TO TRY THE LORAZEPAM AND THE ATIVAN."
AND I -- I STARTED OFF THAT NIGHT TO DO THE LORAZEPAM
AND THE ATIVAN.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND THAT'S NIGHT NUMBER 3.

DR. MURRAY: AND THAT WAS THE NIGHT -DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'S NIGHT NUMBER 3?
DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND THAT WAS --

MR. CHERNOFF: THAT'S THE DAY HE DIED.

DR. MURRAY: AND THAT'S THE NIGHT IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE. IT WASN'T WORKING. SO WAS HE GOING THROUGH A WITHDRAWAL FROM THAT AGENT? WAS IT HIS MIND THAT WAS FORCING HIM TO STAY AWAKE? HE KEPT SAYING THAT, YOU KNOW, HE WAS CONSTANTLY PRODUCING AND HE'S A PRODUCER AND HE'S A WRITER AND HE HAD TO SLEEP; HIS

SHOW WAS GOING TO FALL APART; HE NEEDED TO SLEEP.

THIS IS WHY WE GOT ALL THE WAY TO THE NEXT
DAY, AT DAYLIGHT, WHEN AFTER TRYING ALL NIGHT FROM
NIGHT 2 WITH THOSE TWO AGENTS, I THEN DECIDED TO GO
AHEAD AND GIVE HIM SOME OF THE MILK SO HE COULD GET A
COUPLE OF HOURS SLEEP SO THAT HE COULD PRODUCE,
BECAUSE I CARED ABOUT HIM. I DID NOT WANT HIM TO
FAIL. I HAD NO INTENTIONS OF HURTING HIM. AND I WAS
COMPASSIONATE. BUT WHAT I WAS DOING, TOO, RECOGNIZING
THAT MICHAEL JACKSON MAY HAVE HAD A DEPENDENCY TO A
SUBSTANCE. I WAS TRYING TO WEAN HIM OFF. BUT --

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND YOU WERE DOING THAT SUCCESSFULLY THE TWO NIGHTS PRIOR. SOME LITTLE RESTLESSNESS, LIKE YOU MENTIONED --

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- BUT EVERYTHING UP UNTIL THIS NIGHT, THE NIGHT THAT THIS HAPPENED --

DR. MURRAY: CAN'T GO BACK TO SLEEP. HE

DETECTIVE SMITH: HE'S JUST WIDE AWAKE AFTER YOU'D DONE WHAT YOU COULD FOR HIM.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND HE'S REQUESTING MORE.

AND THEN ULTIMATELY HE REQUESTS THE MILK.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. OKAY?

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: SO WHAT I -- WHAT I DID AT THAT TIME, I -- I REALIZED THAT MAYBE EVEN THOUGH THEY HAVE NOT STUDIED THAT AGENT LIKE THAT ON A REGULAR DAILY BASIS TO A PATIENT AND STUDIES HAVEN'T SHOWN THAT YOU CAN DEVELOP DEPENDENCY, HE WAS CLEARLY PROBABLY SHOWING SIGNS OF A WITHDRAWAL. AND WHETHER THAT WAS ALL PHYSIOLOGICAL, PSYCHOLOGICAL, OR MENTAL, THERE'S A SATISFACTION THAT HE WASN'T GETTING THE MILK, WHICH PROBABLY WAS, WAS INVOLVED, IN THAT, IN THAT PROCESS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHEN -- SO AT THE HOSPITAL, WHEN THEY PRONOUNCE HIM AND THE OTHER DETECTIVES TALKED TO YOU FOR A LITTLE BIT, WHAT -- WHAT HAPPENS THEN? WHAT DO YOU DO?

DR. MURRAY: WHAT DID I DO AFTER TALKING TO THEM?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH.

DR. MURRAY: WELL, AFTER TALKING TO THE DETECTIVES, I GAVE THEM MY CELL PHONE, YOU KNOW, WHERE THEY CAN CONTACT ME.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT.

DR. MURRAY: IT WAS NOW VERY IMPORTANT TO CONSOLE MRS. JACKSON, THE MOTHER OF MICHAEL. I NEVER MET HER BEFORE. BUT WHEN SHE CAME INTO THE HOSPITAL, THE FIRST THING WAS HOW DO YOU BREAK THE NEWS TO HER.

I WAS ALSO TOLD THAT SHE HAD A HEART CONDITION. SO I HAD ASKED THEM TO BE VERY, VERY CAREFUL IN GIVING INFORMATION TO HER. WAS THERE ANY OTHER FAMILY MEMBER PRESENT AT THE TIME? NO. SHE WAS THE ONLY ONE THERE. HIS FATHER WAS EITHER IN ANOTHER STATE, WAS CLEARLY NOT CLOSE. AND I CAN'T TELL ABOUT THE OTHER SIBLINGS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DID YOU LEAVE THE HOSPITAL, OR DID SHE COME TO THE HOSPITAL AND YOU SPOKE WITH HER THERE?

DR. MURRAY: SHE CAME TO THE HOSPITAL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: SO WE -- THEY BROUGHT HER INTO
A ROOM DOWN THE HALL. AND I WENT IN THERE WITH THE
EMERGENCY ROOM PHYSICIAN WHO WAS TREATING HIM, WHOM I
WAS WITH ALL THE TIME THROUGH HIS CODE, AND THEY WOULD
BREAK THE NEWS TO MRS. JACKSON. SO THE DOCTOR STARTED
TO TELL HER THAT, YOU KNOW, HER SON CAME IN AND HE WAS
HAVING DIFFICULTY BREATHING AND THEY TRIED EVERYTHING.
AND SHE SAID, "WELL, HOW IS HE? HE'S NOT
DEAD, IS HE?" AND THE DOCTOR SAID, "YES." AND SHE
BROKE DOWN. IT WAS VERY -- AND WEEPING. WE STAYED
THERE, HELD HER HAND.

THE DOCTOR LEFT. I STAYED. AND THEN I

ASKED FOR -- I ASKED FOR THE SOCIAL WORKERS TO COME

IN, OR PSYCHOLOGIST, WHICHEVER THE HOSPITAL HAD. THEY

BROUGHT THE SOCIAL TEAM. THEY BROUGHT THE HEAD OF PSYCHOLOGY. AND I ASKED THEM TO -- BASED UPON THE NEWS THAT MRS. JACKSON RECEIVED, TO PLEASE HELP HER, TAKE CARE OF HER AT THIS TIME.

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MY NEXT QUESTION WAS "WHERE ARE THE CHILDREN?" I WAS NOT AWARE THAT THE CHILDREN WERE BROUGHT TO THE HOSPITAL. I WAS TOLD THAT THEY WERE IN ANOTHER ROOM OFF SITE AND THEY WERE HAVING SOMETHING DECIDED THE CHILDREN HAD TO BE MADE AWARE OF THE CONDITION, AND THEY NEEDED TO KNOW. SO HOW BEST DO WE DO IT? SO I SPOKE TO FRANK DILEO. HE IS MICHAEL'S MANAGER, FRANK DILEO. AND HE SAID HE WOULD GO IN THERE WITH ME. I SAID, "NO, LET'S GET SOMEONE ELSE, TOO, THAT THEY PRETTY WELL HAVE GOOD CAMARADERIE WITH." AND THIS WAS BROTHER MICHAEL AMIR. SO FRANK DILEO, MYSELF, AND MICHAEL AMIR, WITH A SOCIAL WORKER, WENT INTO THE ROOM WHERE THE THREE CHILDREN WERE HAVING SOMETHING TO EAT. I WALKED IN, AND I'M NOT SURE WHO SPOKE FIRST. BUT SOMEHOW OR THE OTHER, THEY ASKED THE QUESTIONS, AND THE CHILDREN FOUND OUT THAT DADDY WASN'T DOING WELL, THAT HE HAD PASSED AWAY. AND THEN THEY REALLY WERE WEEPING, REALLY WEEPING.

I STAYED THERE. I HUGGED THEM ALL, GAVE
THEM COMFORT TO PARIS, COMFORT TO PRINCE, COMFORT TO
BLANKET, WHICH IS THE LAST LITTLE GUY, BECAUSE

WHENEVER THEY WERE SICK, THEY WOULD ALWAYS ASK FOR DR. CONRAD, "PLEASE CALL DR. CONRAD, YOU KNOW, DADDY." AND I GAVE THEM COMFORT.

MRS. JACKSON'S NOT IN THAT ROOM, THE

MRS. JACKSON, HIS MOTHER. AFTER THEY CRIED AND CRIED

AND CRIED, THEN HIS DAUGHTER UTTERED A LOT OF WORDS OF

UNHAPPINESS AND, YOU KNOW, SHE WILL LIVE ALONE WITHOUT

HER DAD AND SHE DIDN'T WANT TO BE AN ORPHAN. AND REAL

SAD, REAL SAD. SHE'S LIKE MY DAUGHTER. AND I TOLD

HER, YOU KNOW, WE WILL TAKE CARE OF HER. FRANK DILEO

SAID THAT HE WOULD TAKE CARE OF HER ALSO.

AND SHE ASKED ME, "DR. MURRAY, YOU SAID YOU SAVE A LOT OF PATIENTS. YOU KNOW, YOU SAVE PEOPLE WITH HEART ATTACKS, AND YOU COULDN'T SAVE MY DAD." I SAID, "I TRIED MY BEST." AND SHE SAID, "I KNOW THAT, DR. MURRAY. AT LEAST I KNOW. I KNOW YOU TRIED YOUR BEST. I KNOW YOU TRIED YOUR BEST, BUT I'M REALLY SAD. YOU KNOW, I WILL WAKE UP IN THE MORNING, AND I WON'T BE ABLE TO SEE MY DADDY." SHE CRIED AND WAS VERY STARK. AND THEN SHE ASKED TO SEE HIM. AND THEN THAT WAS ANOTHER THING. HOW DO YOU LET THE CHILDREN SEE HIM?

SO BEFORE I SAID "YES," I PULLED A

PSYCHOLOGY TEAM TOGETHER. I'M DOING ALL OF THIS. AND
I SAID, "WE NEED SOME HELP, AND WE NEED SOME BACKUP

HERE. THE CHILDREN NEEDS TO SEE THEIR DADDY. DO YOU THINK IT IS A GOOD IDEA?" I DID NOT MAKE AN INDEPENDENT DECISION ON THAT CASE. AND THEN SOMEBODY SAID, "WELL, YES, THEY SHOULD BRING CLOSURE TO THIS." I SAID, "DO YOU THINK THAT THEY'RE MATURE ENOUGH TO UNDERSTAND IT?" THEY SAY YEAH, THEY THINK SO.

CHILDREN SOME MORE. SHE BROUGHT SOME ASSISTANTS DOWN.

AND THEN THEY MOVED MRS. JACKSON, MICHAEL'S MOTHER, TO

A LARGER ROOM, BIG CONFERENCE ROOM. THE CHILDREN ALSO

JOINED THEIR GRANDMOTHER BECAUSE SHE WANTED TO SEE

GRANDMA. SO SHE WENT TO THE GRANDMOTHER, AND SHE WAS

SOBBING AND WEEPING. AND THEY HELD A LITTLE BIT, I

THINK, GRANDMA. BUT I'M NOT SURE HOW CLOSE THEY ARE,

BECAUSE THE TWO BOYS ARE STILL KIND OF RUNNING AWAY

FROM A DISTANCE. AND PARIS WAS MORE COMFORTED BY A

RELATIVE VERSUS THE GRANDMOTHER, BUT SHE DID WANT TO

SEE HER.

AND WHILE THAT WAS BEING -- WAS HAPPENING, I
ASKED THEM TO PREPARE MR. JACKSON'S BODY, MAKE IT AS
PRESENTABLE AS POSSIBLE, BECAUSE I RECOMMENDED AN
AUTOPSY BE PERFORMED, SO THAT THE CHILDREN WOULD BE
ABLE TO VIEW THEIR DADDY AND HAVE THEM SAY GOOD-BYE TO
HIM AT THIS TIME. AT THAT TIME, THEY -- HIS FAMILY
STARTED TO TRICKLE IN. FIRST PERSON I SAW WAS HIS

BROTHER JERMAINE, I THINK. I DIDN'T KNOW HIM BEFORE.

SOME COUSINS AND THEN LATOYA, HIS SISTER, CAME IN.

SHE SAW HIM, AND THEY WERE BRIEFED, AND THE FAMILY MET

TOGETHER.

AND THEN WHILE THEY WERE PREPARING

MR. JACKSON, AFTER HE WAS PRONOUNCED AND THEY'RE

GETTING HIM READY IN A DIFFERENT ROOM, I WENT INTO THE

BIGGER ROOM WITH THE FAMILY, BIG CONFERENCE ROOM. I

SAT WITH THE FAMILY. MRS. JACKSON, I PULLED MY CHAIR

ALL THE WAY UP TO HER. LATOYA WAS RIGHT THERE. I

HELD THEIR HANDS.

I ASKED THEM IF THEY HAD ANY QUESTIONS, "IS
THERE ANYTHING I CAN DO TO HELP?" THEY ASKED ME, YOU
KNOW, IF I -- "DO YOU KNOW WHY HE DIED?" MY ANSWER
WAS "NO." AND THAT'S THE REASON WHY I WAS
RECOMMENDING TO THE FAMILY TO HAVE AN AUTOPSY, BECAUSE
I ALSO WANTED TO KNOW. THEIR QUESTIONS WERE NOT VERY
DEEP. AND THEY -- YOU KNOW, THEY WERE NOT
(UNINTELLIGIBLE). BUT I WANTED TO BE THERE TO ANSWER
ANYTHING THAT THEY WANTED, ANY QUESTIONS THAT THEY MAY
HAVE HAD. AND I DID THAT.

I -- AFTER THAT, THE BODY WAS READY FOR VIEWING. THE SOCIAL WORKERS HAD CONTROL OF THE CHILDREN. AND THEY TOOK THE ENTIRE TEAM, INCLUDING THE HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT WHO STOOD OUTSIDE IN THE

UP.

HALLWAY, AND THEY WENT IN TO SEE THEIR DAD. I ALSO WENT INTO THE VIEWING AREA. THERE WAS AN OFFICER STANDING THERE WITH ME. AND THERE WAS ANOTHER GLASS PARTITION (UNINTELLIGIBLE). AND THEY SPENT A LONG TIME WITH THE FAMILY, WITH THEIR DAD. THEY CRIED. OTHER PEOPLE CAME IN. I WENT BACK TO THE BIG ROOM.

I -- BECAUSE AT THAT TIME, AFTER THE
CHILDREN HAD SEEN THEIR DAD AND LATOYA AND SO HAD
VIEWED THE BODY, THEY WERE WONDERING AT THAT TIME
STILL WOULD THERE BE MORE RELATIVES COMING, BECAUSE
THEY SAID THAT THERE WAS A TWO-HOUR WINDOW, AT WHICH
POINT THEY HAD TO MOVE HIM TO THE CORONER'S OFFICE OR
THE CORONER WOULD BE THERE. SO I WENT BACK INTO THE
LARGE ROOM, AND I ASKED MRS. JACKSON IF SHE HAD A
DESIRE TO SEE HIM.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: MRS. JACKSON.

DR. MURRAY: HIS MOTHER.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HIS MOTHER.

DR. MURRAY: AND SHE SAID NO.

MR. CHERNOFF: WAS HIS DAD -- THE DAD IS THERE NOW?

DR. MURRAY: NO.

MR. CHERNOFF: NO?

DR. MURRAY: NO, HE NEVER -- HE NEVER SHOWED

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SO FOR THE NEXT PART, I ASKED THE SECURITY GUARD, "SO WHAT IS GOING ON? WELL, YOU KNOW, NOW THAT -- YOU KNOW, THE FAMILY IS JUST BEING HERE. MR. JACKSON -- THEY VIEWED THE BODY, AND NOW THEY'RE WAITING FOR THE CORONER TO MOVE THE BODY BACK. YOU BE ABLE TO TAKE THE CHILDREN HOME? WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO DO?"

AND THEN THE SECURITY GUARD TOLD ME THAT "WELL, NOBODY CAN GO INTO THE HOME AT THIS TIME," THAT THE HOUSE WAS BASICALLY ON LOCKDOWN. SO I SAID, "WELL, WHERE WILL THE CHILDREN GO?" THEY WERE THEN TRYING TO FIGURE OUT WELL, WHERE THEY WILL GO, WITH WHICH RELATIVE. I WAS NOT IN CHARGE OF THIS.

I WAITED AROUND AGAIN FOR A WHILE. AND THEN I WENT TO RANDY PHILLIPS, WHO IS THE C.E.O./PRESIDENT OF A.E.G. LIVE. I THEN SPOKE TO FRANK DILEO AGAIN. SPOKE TO BROTHER MICHAEL AMIR AND OTHER SECURITY GUARDS, "IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE I CAN DO AROUND HERE?" THEY SAID, "NO, DR. MURRAY. WE ARE TOLD NOW THAT WE MAY HAVE TO BE AIR-LIFTED OUT OF HERE BECAUSE OF SO MUCH OF THE CROWD THAT'S OUTSIDE." THAT WAS THE SITUATION I HAD.

SO THEN THEY ASKED FOR HIS BROTHER JERMAINE (UNINTELLIGIBLE) TO THE OTHER BUILDING. SO I WALKED ACROSS ANOTHER PART OF U.C.L.A. AND THEN I WAS

INTRODUCED TO THE LAWYERS OF THE JACKSONS WHO WAS
THERE FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS AND SOME OF THE PRESS.
AND THEY WANTED TO MAKE A PRESS RELEASE. BUT THEY
WANTED ME TO REVIEW THE PRESS RELEASE TO SEE IF IT WAS
OKAY WITH ME.

DETECTIVE SMITH: JERMAINE DID?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. JERMAINE, HE AND A.E.G., RANDY PHILLIPS, WANTED ME TO LOOK AT THAT. AND THE LAWYERS, THEY WANTED ME TO LOOK AT WHAT THEY HAD WRITTEN. AND I KNEW WHAT THEY HAD WRITTEN, AND I EDITED. I ADDED THAT THE CAUSE -- ALTHOUGH IT CAME OUT AS WHAT WAS PRESUMED TO BE A POSSIBLE CARDIAC ARREST, THE UNDERLYING CAUSE OF THAT CONDITION IS NOT KNOWN UNTIL AN AUTOPSY IS PERFORMED. AND I --

MR. CHERNOFF: WHO IS THIS YOU WERE TALKING TO, JERMAINE?

DR. MURRAY: I WAS SPEAKING TO THE -- THE
PRESS RELEASE AND THE LAWYER WHO WAS PREPARING THE
STATEMENT FOR JERMAINE TO GIVE. I THEN -- AFTER DOING
THAT, I THOUGHT IT WAS REASONABLE. THEY DON'T WANT TO
CHANGE ANYTHING. I MEAN IT WAS LEGAL. JERMAINE
WANTED TO CHANGE THE FACT THAT THEY HAD ASKED THE FANS
TO RESPECT THEIR PRIVACY. AND HE SAID, "THAT WON'T BE
A VERY GOOD IDEA BECAUSE THE FANS ARE FANS. MAYBE WE
SHOULD ASK THE MEDIA TO RESPECT OUR PRIVACY." SO HE

ADDED -- HE GOT RID OF "FANS" AND ADDED "MEDIA" FOR PRIVACY.

AND THEN I WENT INTO HIM FURTHER. WE WERE SITTING IN THE CORNER, AND THEN I SPOKE TO HIM AGAIN A LITTLE BIT. AND HE ASKED ME WHERE I WAS FROM, AND I TOLD HIM I WAS BORN IN THE CARIBBEAN, IN TRINIDAD, BECAUSE HE HEARD MY ACCENT. AND I SAID, "ANYTHING ELSE I CAN DO FOR YOU?" AND HE SAID NO, YOU KNOW, THEY'RE WITH THEIR FAMILY; THEY'LL TRY TO DO THEIR BEST IN THIS CONDITION. I ASKED. I SAID, "IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE I CAN DO AROUND HERE?" HE SAID, "NO." I WAS THEN TIRED. I SAID, "OKAY. I'M GOING TO TRY TO MAKE MY WAY HOME." AND I LEFT THE HOSPITAL.

MR. CHERNOFF: YOU SPENT TIME WITH MRS. JACKSON, TOO?

DR. MURRAY: YES. MRS.?

MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH.

DR. MURRAY: OH, YEAH. YEAH.

MR. CHERNOFF: THE PRESS -- BECAUSE JESSE

JACKSON WHO SAID THAT YOU SHOULD HAVE SPENT TIME WITH

THE FAMILY, GIVING THEM COMFORT IN THE LAST HOURS OF

THEIR SON.

DR. MURRAY: YOU WOULDN'T BELIEVE HOW SAD IT
IS TO SIT THERE AND SEE THE NEWS REPORT THAT COMES
AROUND AND IT'S SO FAR FROM THE TRUTH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: UH-HUH. WE REALIZE THAT.

DR. MURRAY: THEY SAID -- THEY SAID THAT I

LEFT THE CAR; I RAN AWAY. I WAS IN THE TRUCK WITH

MR. JACKSON, TRYING TO HELP HIM TO SURVIVE. I WAS

DOING EVERYTHING I CAN. AND I COULDN'T TAKE MY CAR

WITH ME IF I HAD TO HELP HIM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ALL RIGHT. YOU SPOKE WITH

THE DOCTOR -- OR CORRECTION -- DETECTIVE PORCHE?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HE HAD A LITTLE FEDORA

ON.

DR. MURRAY: PORCHE?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HE HAD A FEDORA ON.

HIM AND HIS PARTNER?

DR. MURRAY: HE IS THE GUY. THAT'S THE ONE

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHITE-HAIRED GUY?

DR. MURRAY: THAT'S THE ONE WHO SPOKE TO ME

AT THE HOSPITAL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: RIGHT. OKAY. AND YOU

PROVIDED HIM WITH YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION AND INITIAL
STATEMENT.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: BASICALLY WHAT YOU TOLD

US.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OBVIOUSLY, NOT AS IN DEPTH. WHEN HE TRIED TO GET A HOLD OF YOU SEVERAL TIMES, IT JUST WOULD GO STRAIGHT TO --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: VOICE-MAIL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- VOICE-MAIL.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BY THEN YOUR VOICE-MAIL WAS FILLED. I EVEN TRIED TEXTING YOU A COUPLE TIMES.

DR. MURRAY: WELL, I --

MR. PENA: IS THIS FRIDAY MORNING? IS THAT WHAT YOU'RE --

DETECTIVE SMITH: THIS WOULD BE THAT EVENING.

DR. MURRAY: OH, THE SAME DAY?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, SAME DAY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: THURSDAY EVENING.

MR. PENA: I'LL LET YOU KNOW THAT ALL MORNING FRIDAY IS WHEN HE'S TALKING TO ME VERY EARLY IN THE MORNING.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

MR. PENA: SO IT WAS MY ADVICE TO SIMPLY
LEAVE YOUR PHONE OFF, TALK TO ME. I HAD A BUSY DAY.
I WAS RUNNING AROUND DOING THREE DIFFERENT THINGS,
LOOKING AT THIS STORY. AND SO I TOLD HIM TO WAIT FOR
ME, TO TALK TO YOU LATER.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND THEN I DIDN'T WANT TO BE
BOMBARDED BY A NUMBER OF PEOPLE TRYING TO REACH ME ON
MY CELL PHONE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: BEING MICHAEL'S

ON-AGAIN-OFF-AGAIN PHYSICIAN, ARE YOU AWARE OF ANY

PREEXISTING MEDICAL CONDITIONS THAT HE HAD? I MEAN

YOU TALKED ABOUT HIM BEING POSSIBLY ADDICTED TO THESE

AGENTS, BUT ANYTHING THAT YOU'RE AWARE OF, ANY

PROBLEMS THAT HE HAD?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, AS FAR AS PROBLEMS THAT I TREATED HIM FOR, I TREATED HIM FOR PNEUMONIA.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. WHEN WAS THAT?

DR. MURRAY: I THINK SOMETIME IN 2008.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: OR 2007. 2007, 2008. I CAN'T SAY FOR SURE. I TREATED HIM FOR A FRACTURED TOE, A PRESUMED FRACTURED TOE, WHEN HE GOT UPSET IN HIS HOUSE, HE SAID, FOR SOME REASON AND HE KICKED HIS DOOR AND HURT HIS FEET.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DO YOU REMEMBER WHAT YEAR?

DR. MURRAY: THAT, I THINK, WAS 2008. AND
OTHER THAN THAT I TREATED HIM FOR LIKE UPPER
RESPIRATORY VIRAL SYNDROME, LETHARGY -- I MEAN
WEAKNESS AND A LITTLE BIT DEHYDRATED STATE, BECAUSE HE

DON'T EAT VERY WELL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WAS IT KIND OF CHRONIC WITH HIM?

DR. MURRAY: WHAT?

DETECTIVE SMITH: THE DEHYDRATION AND --

DR. MURRAY: HE DON'T DRINK.

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- FATIGUE.

DR. MURRAY: HE DON'T DRINK AND EAT. HE
SAYS ALL HIS LIFE HIS MOTHER'S HAD TO FORCE HIM TO EAT
AS A CHILD. SO HE JUST DON'T LIKE TO EAT FOODS. AND
THE FOODS THAT HE EATS, WHEN HE EATS, IS MOSTLY
CHICKEN AND RICE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHAT YEAR WAS IT WHEN
YOU TREATED HIM FOR THE UPPER RESPIRATORY VIRAL
SYNDROME?

DR. MURRAY: 2007, 2008. OH, YOU MEAN THE UPPER RESPIRATORY? THAT WAS THE VERY FIRST THING I TREATED HIM FOR. THAT WAS LIKE A VIRAL (UNINTELLIGIBLE) THAT WAS INFECTED IN THE CHILDREN AND HIMSELF, AND THEY WERE COUGHING AND RUNNY NOSE AND NOT DRINKING ENOUGH AND NOT GETTING ENOUGH REST.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'D BE ABOUT 2006?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, THAT WAS THE FIRST TIME.

AND I PROBABLY TREATED HIM A COUPLE OF TIMES, MAYBE

TWO OR THREE TIMES FOR THAT CONDITION.

MR. CHERNOFF: AND THEN HE HAD SOMETHING WRONG ON HIS FOOT.

DR. MURRAY: OH, YEAH.

MR. CHERNOFF: BUT THAT'S (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

DR. MURRAY: WELL --

DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY. GO AHEAD.

DR. MURRAY: AS I LOOKED AT HIS FEET OVER
THE YEARS, YOU KNOW, AS A DANCER, HE HAD CALLOUSES
THAT WERE SO DEEPLY ENGRAVED IN HIS FEET, AND IT WOULD
BE SO PAINFUL WHEN HE DANCED. I GOT A PODIATRIST TO
COME TO THE HOUSE. SO THEY -- WELL, THEY DID CARVE
OUT THE CALLOUS SO THAT HIS PAIN WENT AWAY. AT THE
SAME TIME, WHILE LOOKING AT HIS FEET, HE HAD VERY
SEVERE FUNGAL MYCOSIS, WHICH IS FUNGAL INFECTION THAT
TOOK OVER EVERY TOE AND GOING INTO HIS FLESH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHEN DID YOU NOTICE THAT?

DR. MURRAY: ON MY EXAMINATION.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHEN WAS THIS, THOUGH?
HOW LONG AGO?

DR. MURRAY: (UNINTELLIGIBLE) INITIALLY WHEN I FIRST SAW HIM AND HE HAD HIS SOCKS OFF. WITHIN THE FIRST DAY I SAW HIM, I SAW THAT AS A CONDITION. AND WE TALKED ABOUT IT. WE GOT HIS CALLOUSES TO COME OFF.

DETECTIVE SMITH: BUT HOW LONG AGO? WHAT

YEAR? WHAT MONTH? WAS IT THIS YEAR? WITHIN THE LAST FEW MONTHS?

DR. MURRAY: NO, WITHIN THE -- ABOUT I'D SAY MAYBE A YEAR AND A HALF AGO.

MR. CHERNOFF: ONE OF THE THINGS -- THE IMPORTANT THINGS ABOUT THIS, YOU MIGHT WANT TO TELL THE M.E. IS BEFORE YOU TREATED IT, YOU TREATED IT WITH LAMISIL. THAT'S -- YOU KNOW, THEY DO SELL IT IN CREAM. BUT THE THING IS IF YOU TAKE IT ORALLY, IT'S PRETTY TOUGH ON THE LIVER.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LAMISIL?

DR. MURRAY: LAMISIL.

MR. CHERNOFF: SO THEY DID A FULL -- HE DID A FULL BLOOD WORKUP ON HIM TO MAKE SURE HIS LIVER AND EVERYTHING WAS WITHIN RANGE.

DR. MURRAY: RIGHT.

MR. CHERNOFF: SO AT LEAST YOU HAVE THAT AVAILABLE. IT WAS DONE ON A FAKE NAME BECAUSE HE DIDN'T LIKE ANY OF THAT INFO GETTING OUT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT.

MR. CHERNOFF: BUT -- BUT EVERYTHING WAS IN RANGE; RIGHT?

DR. MURRAY: EVERYTHING WAS FINE.

MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH.

DR. MURRAY: AND THEN I GAVE HIM THE THREE

MONTHS OF THE LAMISIL AND, YOU KNOW, KEPT CHECKING
WITH HIM TO MAKE SURE THAT HE WAS COMPLYING. BUT HE
WAS VERY HAPPY. AT THE END OF THE TREATMENTS, HIS
INFECTION IN THE FOOT -- HIS SKIN WAS SOFT. THERE WAS
NO MORE EXFOLIATION, NO HARDNESS. THE NAILS HAD GROWN
OVER NEW. HE WAS AMAZED. HE WAS VERY HAPPY.

MR. CHERNOFF: IS THERE A -- I'M NOT ASKING FOR ANY TRADE SECRETS, BUT IS THERE ANY PRELIMINARY TOXICOLOGY AT ALL?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NO, NOT THAT THEY SHARED WITH US.

MR. CHERNOFF: IN THE EVENT THERE'S SOME -SINCE WE DON'T KNOW WHAT'S GOING TO SHOW UP EXCEPT WE
KNOW (UNINTELLIGIBLE) THESE THREE DRUGS ARE GOING TO
SHOW UP. WERE YOU AWARE OF ANY OTHER MEDICATIONS HE
WAS TAKING?

DR. MURRAY: I WAS NOT AWARE OF ANY OTHER MEDICATIONS THAT HE WAS TAKING, BUT I HEARD THAT HE WAS SEEING A DR. KLEIN THREE TIMES A WEEK IN BEVERLY HILLS. AND HE NEVER DISCLOSED THAT TO ME.

MR. CHERNOFF: YOU HEARD FROM WHO?

DR. MURRAY: HIS STAFF, LIKE FRANK DILEO,
KENNY ORTEGA. THEY WOULD BE AWARE, WORKING ON HIS
PRODUCTION TEAM, THAT HE WAS SEEING HIM THREE TIMES A
WEEK. RIGHT ABOUT THREE WEEKS AGO, DESPERATELY AROUND

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THIS.

NOON, HE WAS CALLING FOR SOMEONE AT DR. KLEIN'S OFFICE. SO HE CALLED BROTHER AMIR TO CALL DR. KLEIN'S OFFICE. HE WANTED TO SPEAK TO A SPECIAL PERSON THERE. I THINK THE NAME WAS JASON. HE WANTED JASON TO SEE IF HE CAN SQUEEZE HIM IN, YOU KNOW, AROUND THE OTHER PATIENTS.

MR. CHERNOFF: IS THAT WHAT MICHAEL TOLD YOU?

DR. MURRAY: I'M THERE WHILE HE'S DOING

MR. CHERNOFF: (UNINTELLIGIBLE.)

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

MR. CHERNOFF: DID YOU ASK HIM WHAT HE -- WHAT HE NEEDED?

DR. MURRAY: THAT, HE WASN'T DISCLOSING. I
MEAN THAT'S HIS OWN PERSONAL PREFERENCE. YOU KNOW,
HE'S -- HE'S IN CHARGE OF HIS MEDICAL HISTORY. HE
NEVER DECLARED IT TO ME BEFORE, BUT I'D SEEN BOTTLES
OF PILLS AT HIS BEDSIDE THAT HAD DR. KLEIN'S NAME ON
IT. I ALSO SAW LIKE A DR. METZER NAME ON THAT. SO I
REALIZED THAT HE'S ALSO SEEING OTHER PHYSICIANS. BUT
HE DOES NOT DISCLOSE TO ME.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I'M GOING TO GIVE YOU

THE NAMES OF SOME -- I'M GOING TO BUTCHER THE NAMES OF

SOME MEDICINES, AND YOU CAN TELL ME IF IT'S SOMETHING

THAT YOU'VE TREATED HIM WITH.

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PRESCRIBED CLONAZEPAM, WHICH IS RESTORIL, WHICH IS A

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CAN --

HAVE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO CLONAZEPAM, YOU MAY

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: TRAZODONE, NO.

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DIAZEPAM?

DR. MURRAY: YES. I RECENTLY PRESCRIBED

THAT FOR HIM, VERY FIRST TIME.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

MR. CHERNOFF: VALIUM.

DR. MURRAY: VALIUM, WHICH IS VALIUM.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT.

DR. MURRAY: AND THAT AGAIN WAS ONE OF THE EFFORTS TO TRY TO GET HIM OFF THE MILK.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LORAZEPAM?

DR. MURRAY: THAT'S I.V. THAT'S THE ORAL FORM OF THE I.V. ATIVAN, THE SAME THING I'VE GIVEN HIM.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ORAL FORM.

DR. MURRAY: IF THE -- IF THE PILL DOES NOT WORK, BECAUSE WHEN YOU TAKE A MEDICINE BY MOUTH, ABOUT 70 TO 80 PERCENT BECOMES AVAILABLE IN THE BLOODSTREAM

BECAUSE OF ABSORPTION.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YOU SAY IT'S THE ORAL FORM OF --

DR. MURRAY: OF THE LORAZEPAM. REMEMBER THAT? ATIVAN, AND IT WAS GIVEN TO HIM.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, YEAH, RIGHT.
ATIVAN.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH. SO THE FACT THAT HE -IT WASN'T WORKING ORALLY, I WAS WONDERING WHETHER OR
NOT TO GIVE IT TO HIM I.V. HE'LL HAVE A BETTER
CONCENTRATION OF THAT, AND THAT HELP HIM TO SLEEP. SO
THAT'S WHY THAT CAME INTO PLAY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HOW ABOUT FLOMAX?

DR. MURRAY: FLOMAX, I GAVE THAT TO HIM.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT'S THAT USED FOR?

DR. MURRAY: HE WAS -- MR. JACKSON HAD ROUBLE URINATING. HE WOULD DESCRIBE -- AND AGAI

TROUBLE URINATING. HE WOULD DESCRIBE -- AND AGAIN,
YOU KNOW, HE NEVER DISCLOSED EVERYTHING TO ME. THIS
WAS THE REASON -- IN THE COURSE OVER THE LAST FEW
MONTHS, HE EXPLAINED TO ME THAT WHEN HE WENT TO THE
BATHROOM, IT WOULD TAKE HIM HOURS TO URINATE. YOU CAN
COME IN THERE. HE WOULD ACTUALLY WET HIMSELF DOWN.
PEOPLE WOULD LEAVE HIM THERE AND COME BACK, AND HE
STILL COULDN'T GO TO THE BATHROOM. AND I SAID,

"REALLY? YOU'VE HAD THAT?"

I DID CHECK HIS P.S.A. BEFORE, HIS

PROSTATE-SPECIFIC ANTIGEN (UNINTELLIGIBLE), AND IT WAS

WITHIN RANGE. SO I THOUGHT THAT HE HAD BENIGN

PROSTATIC HYPERTROPHY, BECAUSE IF IT'S ELEVATED, YOU

THINK OTHER THINGS. AND SO FLOMAX IS A VERY GOOD

MEDICATION THAT WILL SHRINK THE PROSTATE AND ALLOW HIM

TO HAVE A PROPER STREAM. SO THAT'S BASICALLY WHY HE

STARTED THAT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT. NOW,
NYSTATIN CREAM MIXED WITH SOME STEROID, IS THAT
SOMETHING THAT YOU GIVE HIM?

DR. MURRAY: NYSTATIN?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NYSTATIN WITH TRIA --

DR. MURRAY: MAYBE TRIAMCINOLONE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'S IT.

DR. MURRAY: I DID NOT -- YEAH, I DID NOT GIVE HIM THAT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: HE PROBABLY GOT THAT FROM SOMEBODY ELSE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT'S THAT USED FOR?

DR. MURRAY: THAT IS SOMETIMES -- IT'S A -THE NYSTATIN IS AN ANTIFUNGAL AGENT. THE
TRIAMCINOLONE IS A CORTICOSTEROID. AND I DON'T -- I

DON'T KNOW IF HE'S HAVING SOME KIND OF JOCK ITCH OR SOMETHING ELSE --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LIKE ATHLETE'S FOOT?
DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH, OR THE TOENAIL.

DR. MURRAY: ATHLETE'S FOOT? NOT NECESSARILY, BECAUSE THAT'S CLEARED UP.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: HIS FEET IS NOW -- IT'S CLEARED UP. AND HE DID NOT HAVE ANY RESIDUAL ATHLETE'S FOOT OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT. SO HE'S USING IT FOR SOMETHING ELSE THAT I DON'T KNOW. IT COULD BE A JOCK ITCH OR SOMETHING LIKE THAT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LATANOPROST?

DR. MURRAY: WHAT'S THAT?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LATANOPROST.

DR. MURRAY: HOW DO YOU SPELL THAT?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: L-A-T-A-N-O-P-R-O-S-T.

IT'S AN EYE DROP SOLUTION, USUALLY USED FOR GLAUCOMA?

DR. MURRAY: IS IT ALSO CALLED OPCON,

OPCON-A?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I DON'T KNOW. WELL, IT DIDN'T HAVE ANY BRAND NAME. IT JUST SAID LATANOPROST ON IT.

DR. MURRAY: I DON'T KNOW. IS IT OVER-THE-COUNTER?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NO. NO, IT'S PRESCRIBED.

DR. MURRAY: IF IT'S A PRESCRIBED AGENT, I DON'T KNOW FOR THAT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ANY PROBLEMS WITH HIS EYES THAT YOU'RE AWARE OF?

MR. CHERNOFF: IT'S XALATAN.

DR. MURRAY: WHAT'S IT?

MR. CHERNOFF: XALATAN.

DR. MURRAY: OH, SOMEBODY ELSE GAVE HIM

THAT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: XALATAN; RIGHT?

MR. CHERNOFF: WHATEVER.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

MR. CHERNOFF: I'M JUST SHOWING THESE GUYS (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

DR. MURRAY: THAT'S -- THAT'S INTERESTING,

TOO, BECAUSE HE NEVER HAD SEEN AN OPHTHALMOLOGIST. I

WAS TRYING TO TAKE --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IT CAME IN THREE VIALS.

DR. MURRAY: REALLY?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, THREE GLASS VIALS FILLED WITH LIQUID THAT YOU COULD USE A DROPPER OR YOU COULD USE A SYRINGE. BUT IT IS A PRESCRIBABLE ONE,

BUT THERE WASN'T THE NAME OF THE DOCTORS WHO PRESCRIBED IT. SO --

DR. MURRAY: SURPRISE, SURPRISE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. HOW ABOUT --

DR. MURRAY: LET'S TALK ABOUT THAT FOR A MINUTE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: BECAUSE THAT'S AGAIN ANOTHER
SURPRISE FOR ME. THAT'S WHY I DON'T KNOW EXACTLY ALL
THAT HE HAS AVAILABLE TO HIM. MR. JACKSON, I
SCHEDULED AN APPOINTMENT WITH DR. DIVAN (PHONETIC),
SOMEBODY FROM U.C.L.A. KNOWN TO BE VERY GOOD AT RADIAL
KERATOTOMY SURGERY FOR THE EYES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: UH-HUH.

DR. MURRAY: RECENTLY, BECAUSE MR. JACKSON BUYS THESE READERS OVER-THE-COUNTER. HE HAS A MAGNIFICATION GLASS.

MR. CHERNOFF: THAT'S WHAT I GOT. THEY WORK GREAT. IF YOU LOSE ONE, YOU JUST REPLACE IT.

DR. MURRAY: HE HAS -- HE HAS A

MAGNIFICATION GLASS. HIS EYESIGHT WAS VERY, VERY BAD.

SO I DID FIGURE OUT HE COULD BE LEGALLY BLIND. HIS

EYES WAS ALSO VERY RED. I ASK HIM ABOUT GLAUCOMA TO

SEE -- BECAUSE I'M TRYING TO TAKE CARE OF HIM IN

GENERAL. AND HE SAYS NO, HE DON'T HAVE ANY GLAUCOMA.

AND EVEN I SPOKE TO HIM AT THAT TIME. HE NEVER TOLD ME HE WAS SEEING A DOCTOR THAT HAD GIVEN HIM ANY SUBSTANCE LIKE THAT FOR THE EYES.

JUST LAST WEEK I GOT THIS DOCTOR FROM

U.C.L.A. TO SEE HIM. LAST SUNDAY, THEY WERE GOING TO

OPEN THEIR CLINIC TO DO A COMPLETE DILATION, LOOK IN

THE BACK OF HIS EYES, CHECK HIS FUNDUS AND SEE WHAT

WAS HAPPENING, AND SEE IF THEY WERE GOING TO GIVE HIM

ANY MONOCULAR VISION OR CONTACTS, BECAUSE I WAS

WORRIED THAT WHEN HE WAS IN ENGLAND, IF YOU'RE NOT

SEEING ON THE STAGE AND ALL THE BRIGHT LIGHTS, MAYBE

YOU CAN FALL AND HURT YOURSELF. SO I ENCOURAGED HIM

TO HAVE THE EYE EXAMINATION. THAT EXAMINATION WAS

HOPEFULLY SCHEDULED FOR LAST MONDAY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HE HAD AGREED TO IT?

DR. MURRAY: HE AGREED TO DO IT. BUT IT

NEVER HAPPENED. I STILL HAVE E-MAIL FROM THE DOCTOR

ASKING ME TO CALL AND RESCHEDULE IT. AND ONE THING OR

THE OTHER, IT LED TO THAT BEING PUT OFF. BUT HIS

TEAM, HIS PRODUCTION TEAM, AGREED THAT, YOU KNOW, IT'S

SOMETHING THAT HE SHOULD HAVE DONE. SO I WAS TRYING

TO FIND OUT ISSUES WITH MR. JACKSON AND TRYING TO

ADDRESS THEM IN A GRADUAL WAY OVERALL TO HELP HIM.

AND THAT WAS ONE OF THE THINGS I DISCOVERED. SO THAT

MEDICATION IS A SURPRISE.

THAT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HOW ABOUT VALISONE?

DR. MURRAY: VALISONE?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, IT'S A STEROID CREAM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ALMOST LIKE A VASELINE.

DR. MURRAY: OH, NO, I DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IT'S FOR LIKE SOME TYPE OF INFLAMMATION OF SKIN?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, I AM TOLD THAT DR. KLEIN IS A -- IS MAYBE A DERMATOLOGIST. I DON'T KNOW. BUT HIS PRODUCTION TEAM HAD -- HAD SAID TO ME RECENTLY THAT HIS WORST DAYS ON THE SET IS WHEN HE HAD GONE TO DR. KLEIN'S OFFICE, WHICH IS ABOUT THREE TIMES A WEEK; AND WHEN HE CAME BACK, HE WAS BASICALLY WASTED AND REQUIRED AT LEAST 24 HOURS FOR RECOVERY. NOW --

MR. CHERNOFF: IS THAT ARNOLD KLEIN?

DR. MURRAY: I DON'T REMEMBER. K-L-E-I-N.

MR. CHERNOFF: BEVERLY HILLS?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, BEVERLY HILLS. SO I
WASN'T CERTAIN, AGAIN, WHY HE NEVER SHARED WITH ME, IF
YOU WANT ME TO BE YOUR TEAM AND OVERLOOK THINGS FOR
YOU, WHY WOULDN'T HE HAVE SHARED WITH ME THE FACT THAT

HE WAS SEEING A DERMATOLOGIST OR ANOTHER DOCTOR FOR
ANY KIND OF TREATMENT. THAT, HE DID NOT SHARE. THE
ONLY TIME I GOT HOLD OF THE ACTIVITY TRYING TO GET
INTO THE CLINIC, THAT DAY WHEN HE SAID HE HAD TO GO,
IT WAS VERY IMPORTANT. HE WAS INSISTING ON THAT.
THAT'S WHEN HE CALLED AROUND NOON TO THAT PLACE, ASKED
FOR JASON AND TRIED TO SEE IF HE CAN BE SQUEEZED IN.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HOW ABOUT BENOQUIN?
DR. MURRAY: BENOQUIN, YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IS THAT SOMETHING THAT

YOU ---

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

MR. CHERNOFF: WHAT IS IT?

DR. MURRAY: BENOQUIN, 20 PERCENT.

MR. CHERNOFF: WHAT IS IT?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHAT DOES IT DO?

DR. MURRAY: IT'S A -- IT'S A CREAM MADE FOR BLEACHING OR PERMANENTLY REMOVING SPOTS THAT WILL ACCUMULATE ON THE SKIN. LIKE, FOR EXAMPLE, IF ONE HAS VITILIGO AND YOU HAVE BLEMISHES ON YOUR SKIN, LIKE DARK AND WHITE SPOTS THAT YOU DEVELOP, YOU CAN USE BENOQUIN. IT TAKES FOR ABOUT NINE MONTHS OF THERAPY. IT'S A VERY SAFE AGENT. AND IT WILL -- IT CAN PERMANENTLY REMOVE THE SPOT.

THE PRIOR INJECTION MARKS. THAT WAS SOMETHING THAT YOU NOTICED YOURSELF IN YOUR EXAMINATION AND CAUSE FOR HIS VEINS TO HARDEN AND MAKE THEM MORE DIFFICULT TO FIND.

DR. MURRAY: PHLEBITIS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH.

DR. MURRAY: THAT'S A -- THAT'S ANOTHER REASON WHY I THOUGHT HIS CAUSE OF DEATH COULD HAVE BEEN A PULMONARY EMBOLISM OR A BLOOD CLOT MIGRATED TO HIS LUNGS.

MR. CHERNOFF: IT PRODUCES IRREVERSIBLE DEPIGMENTATION, BENOQUIN.

DR. MURRAY: THAT'S WHAT I SAID, PERMANENT.

MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH, COULDN'T TELL.

DR. MURRAY: NOW, HE ALSO HAD SOMETHING

CALLED HYDROQUIN, HYDROQUINONE, WHICH IS 8 PERCENT

CREAM, WHICH IS USED FOR TEMPORARY REMOVAL OF -- OF

SPOTS. IT WORKS MORE QUICKLY, BUT IT'S NOT PERMANENT.

SO YOU KNOW, HE WOULD USE BOTH IN CASE THERE WAS A

BLEMISH. HE WOULD FOLLOW THE 8 PERCENT WITH THE

20 PERCENT. AND WHEN THE -- THE SPOT WENT AWAY, HE

WOULD THEN TRY TO CONTINUE USING THE OTHER ONE SO IT

DOESN'T (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WE FOUND A SMALL

PORTION OF MARIJUANA IN HIS ROOM. DID YOU KNOW HIM TO BE A SMOKER?

DR. MURRAY: NO. MARIJUANA?

MR. CHERNOFF: WHICH ROOM? THE ONE THAT YOU DON'T GO INTO OR --

DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH, THE ONE YOU'D STAY OUT OF, YOU DON'T GO INTO.

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: HE DENIED SO CLEARLY. I

FELT -- YOU KNOW, NOW THAT I'M FINDING OUT ALL OF

THESE THINGS AND IT'S PIECE BY PIECE, I -- I GAVE

MR. JACKSON LOVE. I WAS HIS FRIEND. I CARED ABOUT

HIM. I TRIED TO HELP HIM. THAT'S ALL I WAS TRYING TO

DO. AND I FEEL THAT NOW TO KNOW THAT, YOU KNOW, HE

WOULD BE USING THINGS LIKE THAT --

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WELL, THE MARIJUANA WE FOUND WAS OLD. IT HAD ALREADY ROTTED AWAY.

DR. MURRAY: OH, IT ROTTED AWAY.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: IT WAS IN A SUITCASE, IN A CLOSET, BURIED. FAMILY MEMBERS CAME ACROSS IT WHEN THEY WERE CLEANING.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, IT WASN'T LIKE A FRESH JOINT OR ANYTHING. IT WAS SOMETHING THAT HAD

ROTTED.

DETECTIVE SMITH: SO WHO KNOWS. I DOUBT
THAT HE WOULD EVEN PACK HIS OWN SUITCASE WHEN HE WENT
AWAY.

WHAT ABOUT CIGARETTES?

DR. MURRAY: NO, HE PACKED HIS SUITCASE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: DID HE?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, I KNOW THAT FOR A FACT.
HE PACKED -- HE PACKS CERTAIN SUITCASE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: CLOTHES OR OTHER THINGS?

DR. MURRAY: HE WOULD PACK CERTAIN SUITCASES
THAT HE WOULD (UNINTELLIGIBLE) BECAUSE HE WAS -- HE
WOULD BE FAMILIAR WITH WHERE CERTAIN THINGS WOULD BE
AND HE WOULD WANT TO KNOW THAT AND KEEP THAT
EXCLUSIVELY TO HIMSELF.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT ABOUT CIGARETTES?

DR. MURRAY: I DON'T KNOW HIM TO SMOKE. YOU
FOUND CIGARETTES?

DETECTIVE SMITH: EMPTY PACKS.

DR. MURRAY: REALLY?

DETECTIVE SMITH: IN THE SAME SUITCASE THAT THIS LITERALLY WAS RAUNCHY OLD -- YOU COULDN'T EVEN TELL IT WAS MARIJUANA. IN FACT, WE THOUGHT IT WAS INITIALLY TAR HEROIN. WE HAD IT ANALYZED, AND IT WAS JUST DECOMPOSED BASICALLY MARIJUANA. THE T.H.C. WAS

PRESENT. NONETHELESS, THERE WAS TWO EMPTY PACKS OF CIGARETTES IN THERE. I KNOW HIS FAMILY'S DEFINITELY AGAINST THAT.

DR. MURRAY: WOW.

DETECTIVE SMITH: BUT AGAIN, WHO KNOWS.

DR. MURRAY: WELL, BUT AT THE SAME TIME, YOU KNOW, NO ONE WENT INTO THAT ROOM. HE WOULDN'T LET ANYONE IN. BUT HE USED EXCESSIVE COLOGNE. AND I NEVER UNDERSTOOD HOW HE SPRAYED THAT MUCH ON ALL THE TIME. I MEAN HE SAT AND HE JUST KEEP SPRAYING. AND IT COULD HAVE BEEN TO DISMISS ANY ODOR. I DON'T KNOW.

DETECTIVE SMITH: MENTIONING SOME DOCTORS, WE TALKED ABOUT A DR. LEE.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND SHE -- WAS SHE IN

VEGAS?

DR. MURRAY: NO, SHE'S HERE IN CALIFORNIA.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHERE AT? DO WE KNOW?

DR. MURRAY: IT HAS TO BE LOS ANGELES,
BECAUSE THIS IS WHERE APPARENTLY SHE WAS COMING IN AND
GIVING HIM INFUSIONS, DIFFERENT -- DIFFERENT TIMES
DURING THE WEEK. THAT'S WHAT HE TOLD ME.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND THEN THERE WAS ALSO A -- THE DR. DAVID ADAMS IN LAS VEGAS.

DR. MURRAY: HE'S IN LAS VEGAS, UH-HUH.

KNOW. I SAW IT ON THE BOTTLES OF MEDICINES AT THE BEDSIDE. SO IF YOU LOOK AT THE BOTTLES, YOU'LL SEE THE DOCTOR'S NAME ON IT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LIKE M-E-T-Z-G-E-R?
DR. MURRAY: Z-E-R, YEAH.

(UNINTELLIGIBLE.)

DR. MURRAY: YOU'LL SEE THE PRESCRIPTION BOTTLES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: THESE -- THE EVENING THAT
THIS WAS GOING ON AT MR. JACKSON'S HOUSE, HIS FINAL
NIGHT, THESE DIFFERENT SYRINGES OR ONE SYRINGE WAS
USED WHEN YOU INJECTED IT INTO HIS I.V. DRIP DOWN
BELOW?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH ONE SYRINGE FOR THAT, YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ONE SYRINGE WAS USED FOR THE VARIOUS MEDICATIONS YOU GAVE HIM, OR --

DR. MURRAY: NO, I HAD --

DETECTIVE SMITH: -- EACH TIME WAS IT A --

DR. MURRAY: NO, I HAD TWO SYRINGES, AND

THEY WERE -- I WOULD RECAP THEM, IF I NEEDED IT. AND

YOU KNOW, I WOULD USE THE MEDICATION, AND THEN I WOULD

DRAW SOME SALINE TO HAVE THEM MIX. RIGHT AWAY THEN I

WOULD USE IT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT DID YOU DO WITH THOSE SYRINGES WHEN YOU WERE DONE WITH THEM?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, I USUALLY HAVE MY BAGS
RIGHT THERE. EVERYTHING I USE, I WOULD PUT IT QUICKLY
INTO THE BAGS AND, YOU KNOW, JUST PUT IT INTO THE
CUPBOARD, BECAUSE HE WANTED ME TO NOT HAVE ANYTHING
HANGING AROUND.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHERE'S YOUR BAG WHERE THOSE SYRINGES WOULD BE AT NOW?

MR. CHERNOFF: OH, REALLY?

DR. MURRAY: I DON'T HAVE THEM.

MR. CHERNOFF: I THOUGHT YOU LEFT IT THERE.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, I DID.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHERE? WHERE DID YOU

LEAVE IT?

DR. MURRAY: IN THAT SAME BEDROOM, IN THE CLOSET, WHERE IT ALWAYS STAYS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. WHICH CLOSET? IT'S A MESS.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IT'S 45 CUPBOARDS.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, IF YOU WALK INTO THE DRESSING ROOM AND YOU TURN RIGHT, THE HIGH LEVEL TOP, THE BAGS ARE RIGHT THERE WITH THE ITEMS IN IT AND THE MEDICATION.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IS THAT THE CLOSET THAT HAS THE GLASS CABINETS WITH HIS JACKETS?

DR. MURRAY: YES. BUT THIS WILL BE TOO
SHORT STUBS HIGHER UP THERE. HE SHOWED ME THAT
CABINET. HE WANTED ME TO KEEP THE THINGS THERE WITH
MY BAGS AND SO.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND THAT'S WHERE YOU LEFT YOUR BAGS THAT NIGHT?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: BLACK ATTACHE BAGS?

DR. MURRAY: THREE BAGS. THERE WERE THREE.

ONE IS A LITTLE COSTCO BLUE BAG. ONE IS A BLACK SMALL

BAG. THE OTHER ONE IS A LITTLE BLUE BAG THAT HAS A

ZIPPER AT THE TOP OF IT.
